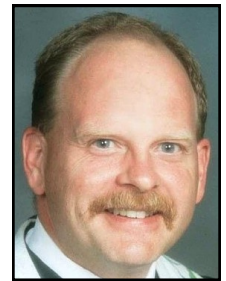

Mere Christianity

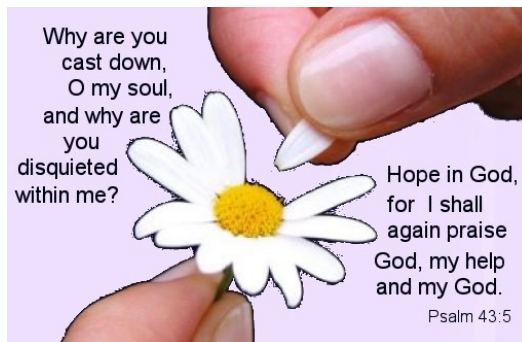
As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the Living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God? My tears have been my food day and night, while people say to me continually, 'Where is your God?'...**Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God, for I shall again praise God, my help and my God...**Deep calls to deep at the thunder of your cataracts; all of your waves and billows have gone over me. By day, God commands God's steadfast love, and at night God's song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life...**Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God, for I shall again praise God, my help and my God."** Psalm 42:1-3, 5, 7-8, 11

"Vindicate me, O God, and defend my cause against an ungodly people; from those who are deceitful and unjust deliver me! For you are the God in whom I take refuge; why have you cast me off? Why must I walk about mournfully because of the oppression of the enemy? O send out your light and truth; let them lead me; let them bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling. Then I will go to the altar of God, to God my exceeding joy; and I will

praise you with the harp, O God, my God. **Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God, for I shall again praise God, my help and my God."** Psalm 43:1-5

Intriguing thoughts abound in a daily devotional that I was using as my personal prayer guide during our recent Alpha Omega Youth Mission Trip. A number of the daily entries referred to writings of author C. S. Lewis. This author may be best known for his work **The Chronicles of Narnia** [1954]. Lewis also wrote many other books. Among his works is a compilation of pieces which initially were radio broadcast pieces ("The Case for Christianity" [1942]; "Christian Behavior" [1943]; and "Beyond Personality" [1944]). Ultimately, these were combined and published under one title: **Mere Christianity**. Lewis believed in radical, Christian "conversion." Of course, Holy Scripture is filled with incidents that can be described as faith conversions. Lewis himself was a "convert" to Christianity. He and his brother

were on a motorcycle going to visit a zoo. His brother was driving, and C. S. Lewis was riding in the sidecar. As he describes it, somewhere along the way he was "*surprised by joy.*" At the beginning of



the trip, he did not believe that Jesus Christ was the Son of God. By the end of the motorcycle ride, he found himself believing what he thought he never could.

The theology of C. S. Lewis grew to hinge strongly on belief in “redemption” given by God. In other words, God became human to turn creatures into daughters and sons of God, not simply to produce “better” people of the old kind! All that Christ Jesus gives can be summed up in two words: **new creation**. Christ brings redemption, not improvement. This is not like teaching a horse to jump better and better. It is, instead, like turning a horse into an entirely **new creature**. It is not as if we just need a little medicine. For instance, take Jesus’ dear friend Lazarus. Jesus did not roll the stone away from the tomb and give Lazarus an antibiotic! Lazarus was dead. He received **new creation**, not improvement. He was made a **new creature**. Jesus shouted, “Lazarus, come out!” And his dead friend came alive. God brought Lazarus from death to life.

Esteemed companion in Christ, the Rev. Dr. Howard Thurman, writes, “Faith teaches...that God is. The second thing...faith teaches...about God is that God is near. One of the sayings of Jesus discovered among the papyri at Oxyrhynchus is this: ‘Jesus saith: Wheresoever they may be, they are not without God; and where there is one alone, even then I am with this one. Raise the stone, and there thou shalt find Me; cleave the wood, and I am there.’...Very often, we find it difficult to think of God as a part of life because we associate God rather exclusively with the supernatural, the miraculous, the unusual. God belongs in the *special services* division of human life, where only the rare and extraordinary aspects of life are to be found. It was this conception that Jesus sought to undermine in his day. If God be far away, then God comes to us only on rare occasions and in rare situations. Of course, there is a sense in which this is true; the high moment, the great experience, the supreme challenge, the poignant sense of great contrition, all these may mark a sense of special Presence. But we do not live in such rarefied atmosphere. What we most want to know about God is whether God is present in the commonplace experiences of ordinary living, available to ordinary people under the garden variety of circumstances. That God is not far from any one of us is the essence of the Gospel which Jesus proclaimed. ‘Closer is God than breathing, nearer than hands or feet.’” **Deep is the Hunger** [1951]

God is. God is near. And God has **power**.

At the ancient Jaffa gate in Jerusalem, stands the oldest Anglican church in the Eastern Hemisphere. Enter into the sanctuary of Christ Church and you will find these words etched in stone: “**I am not ashamed of the gospel: it is the power of God for salvation...**” (Romans 1:16)

Over and over, the gospel transforms us: a **power** from beyond ourselves, bringing healing, forgiveness,

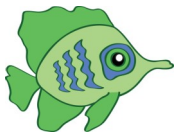

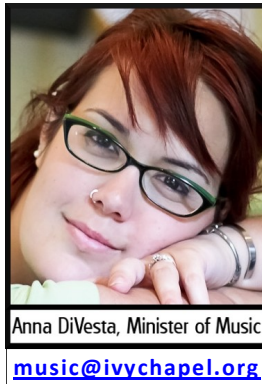


The Note
