God is mighty. There is no equivalent for the Might of God.

Moment by moment, miracles are being born. Mighty God is the Author of all things good. The very “birth” of the Christian Church was blessed through God’s presence, which came “like the rush of a **mighty** wind” (Acts of the Apostles 2:2).

God’s power and might are above all.
