A Virtue We May Learn

Is God still learning? For years now, our United Church of Christ has been proclaiming, "God is still **speaking**,..." Lately, I have wondered whether or not God is still learning. Perhaps, this is an impossible question to answer. There are ways to try. One could contend that God is "Infinite Wisdom," and so all wisdom issues from God. Therefore, God does not "learn" - never has; doesn't need to; already knows! This would be a solid viewpoint.

Or what if we were to try a "less travelled" view? Ponder the idea that God does learn. The way I look at it, this does not negate a belief in the Ultimate Wisdom of God. Personally, I still would like to claim this belief. I believe that the Wisdom of God is Supreme. It's just that, at the same time, I venture that God may be "learning, changing, growing..." What do you believe?

We've been examining some very circuitous writing of the Apostle Paul at small group Bible study recently. As you may be aware, one often must wade through a lot to extract certain benefits from Paul's letters. And I do mean a lot! Second Corinthians may well be the most "involved" of all of the apostle's letters. Nevertheless, not long ago, our Sunday morning group derived one clear teaching from Chapter 10: **The Gospel is about Jesus Christ, not us. God is central to life, not us.** This is an echo of sorts from

Paul's first letter to the Church at Corinth: "...we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, the power of God and the wisdom of God... God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are; so that no one might boast in the presence of God... Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." (1 Cor. 1:23-24, 28-29, 31) This message also reverberates earlier in Second Corinthians: "For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord..." (2 Cor. 4:5) Eventually, it emerges in the latter portion of this letter: "We do not dare classify or compare ourselves with some of those who commend themselves. But when they measure themselves by one another, and compare themselves with one another, they do not show good sense. We, however, will not boast beyond limits...Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." (2 Cor. 10:12-13, 17) It is from this rather elaborate passage that our small group derived: **More of God. Less of us.**

Can we connect this with some concept of a "still-learning God"? Most of us are familiar with the Gospel declaration: "And Jesus

increased in wisdom and in stature, and in divine and human favor.” (Luke 2:52) I interpret this to be a statement that Jesus was learning. Well, sure, this makes sense. Early on, Jesus was a growing boy, so to speak. Was there at some point, a moment in his life when Jesus of Nazareth quit learning? I’d say, “No.” From whom does Jesus learn? Potentially, Jesus may learn from anyone whom he encounters. (The same is true for us!) There are many people who teach Jesus, including: rabbis at Jerusalem’s Temple (Luke 2); his mother Mary (John 2); a Roman centurion (Matthew 8); a sinner in a Pharisee’s house (Luke 7); a woman with a hemorrhage (Mark 5, Luke 8); a Samaritan woman at Jacob’s well (John 4); his ancestor David (Matthew 12); a man at the pool of Bethesda (John 5); a Syrophenician woman (Matthew 15, Mark 7); Simon Peter (Matthew 16, Mark 8, Luke 9); one leper (Luke 17); a blind man on the roadside (Luke 18); Zacchaeus (Luke 19); a widow (Mark 12, Luke 21); one criminal crucified alongside of him (Luke 23). This is only a partial list.

In addition, I offer you one more example: **Jesus learns from John the Baptist.** John’s disciples come to tell him that someone whom he had baptized is now across the river baptizing. “All are going to him,” John’s disciples complain. John reacts calmly, reassuring them, “No one can receive anything except what has been given from heaven...I am not the Messiah, but I have been sent ahead of him...**He must increase. I must decrease.**” (John 3:25-30) This is John’s way of saying, “**More of God. Less of me.**”

What Christ learns, he demonstrates. Christ’s life is a teaching. Christ displays “self-giving love.” As Scripture describes, Christ Jesus “...emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he **humbled himself** and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.” (Philippians 2:7-8) Yes, Christ is humble. Further, Christ implores us to humble ourselves. See Ephesians 5:2. Offer your life as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. Take John the Baptist’s approach: **Christ must increase. I must decrease.**

It appears clear to me that Christ learns, changes, grows. May we follow. Christian disciples are children of God who continue learning, changing, growing.

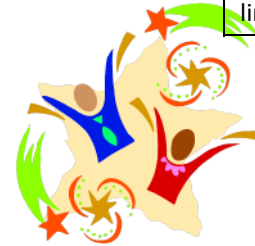

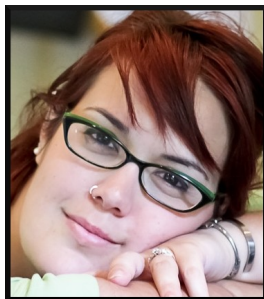

Psalm 23:5

*"You prepare a table before me in the presence
of my enemies;
you anoint my head with oil;
my cup overflows."*

Some days you can just hear the tinny sound of your own empty cup. You drag yourself around the office or the kitchen. You walk with your head down. You forget to smile. You forget you even knew how to laugh. Other days there is a wiggle in your walk, a 23rd psalm on your lips, a lift in your heart. You start sentences with **YAY**, though I walk through the shadow of death, I fear no evil. You begin from the resurrection instead of from the crucifixion.

What is the difference between an empty cup and a full one? The difference is in the risk of emptying it. Overflow energy comes after we spill, not before. Instead we hear the waterfall in the background, the replenishing of plenitude released. Plenitude hoarded gets tinny. Spilled, it flows. Our cups overflow if we empty them.

I think Asa, age 2 years 8 months, can help us. His mother tells this story of what a teacher noted on his report card: "Ms. Allison got bumped in the mouth and Asa hugged her and kept saying, 'It's okay! You're doing a good job.'" Asa could have cried or cornered or avoided. Instead, he connected. His tears spilled with her spill and both were helped by the connection. "Doing a good job" might not be ideal language, but at least Asa understands that loving is work. At least now we know what Asa has in his cup and what he is willing to do with it.

Prayer

O God, give us a way out of the tomb of empty cups and dissolute days. Amen.

Ivy Chapel is fast approaching the 50th anniversary of faith, fellowship and facility. The new AC complementing the new furnace was installed a few weeks ago and is ready to cool us off in July. Other things at Ivy Chapel may have been stored for 50 years now and may need to be purged. It is the hope of the Trustees to identify some of those things and remove or relocate. There is a need to reorganize some of the storage areas for better performance and practicality. Other corresponding boards or members should review their "storage piles" and purge accordingly.

Members of Ivy Chapel may sometimes wonder if they can borrow certain assets or equipment that belongs to Ivy Chapel and its members. Maybe you're having a large graduation party and you need one or two large pots to cook 50 gallons of Sue Wilson's famous Cheese Burger soup. Or perhaps a table or two? Well, members can borrow those items. All you need to do is call "easy going" Ralph Weiland and let him know what?, when? and how much? Ralph has agreed to be the "go to" contact for such requests.

The Trustees wish to thank Ivy Chapel members for the extra financial support of some projects above and beyond expectations recently and for some of their diplomatic requests to get things fixed. ☺
