


"New-ness" Beyond Words

As I write this reflection, we are mid-way through the Lenten Season. By the time you read this, we will be nearing Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday.

This is a rich juncture in the Church's annual journey towards the Day of Resurrection. As I began preparing to write this message, an initial thought I had was that this should be a fairly easy piece to compose because it will have to do with the Church's Day of days—Easter Sunday. However, soon I began feeling this was actually quite a difficult piece to write. After all, how does one do justice to the miracle of Christ's Resurrection? You and I can agree it is impossible to put any true miracle into human words. Further then, consider that the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is God's ultimate miracle! Now you may realize why commenting on this seems to be a daunting endeavor.

Christian faith, as I view it, is both (1) basic and (2) beyond words. Pastor and author Fred Buechner seems to regard Christian faith similarly. In fact, Buechner once composed a marvelous, spiritual anthology titled <u>Beyond Words: Daily Readings in the ABC's of Faith</u>. This book is a collection of terms and names that point to the realm of mystery and depth which lies beyond our ordinary experience.

Our faith is basic and *beyond words*. It is both. Similarly, our faith in Jesus Christ as the Son of God

is simple. And it also is *beyond* our ability to express fully.

This brings me back to Easter. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is a phenomenal event. It is a miracle of God which cannot be humanly explained—though many continue to try! It strikes me as disappointing when someone (especially clergy) tries to "explain" complex events in Christ's ministry including the Crucifixion and the Resurrection. Often, I find that those trying so hard to come across as authoritative are purporting claims that no human honestly can make. In my humble opinion, no one but God is capable of providing "true commentary" on such exceptional events.

Human know-it-alls still attempt this. But I view anyone who makes excessive, definitive claims about the Resurrection to be someone stating as "facts" things which no human being entirely comprehends. Claims intended to come across with indisputable authority tend to be claims largely "of this world." And we are aware Christ tells his interrogators, "...you are of this world, I am not of this world" (John 8:23); Christ encourages his disciples to be "not of this world" (John 17:16); and Christ responds to Pontius Pilate, "My kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36).

So, beware. At times, certain experts purport to "know" more than truly can be known.

All this may lead you to ask, "Okay, Pastor Dan, then is there anything that we can know?"

My response to this is an echo of what I've already shared. Yes, I believe we can state some very limited claims about the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. In all likelihood, these claims are so basic that they do not satisfy some people. This is, I suspect, what drives many to forge on into unknown territory and emerge claiming we know things which we do not. I can't help this.

I believe basic claims such as the ones below are true of the Resurrection:

- 1) The Ministry of Jesus Christ has many aspects.
- 2) The Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ are a unit.
- 3) The Resurrection is one portion of the whole Ministry of Jesus Christ.
- 4) Jesus Christ lived.
- 5) Jesus Christ died. He was killed. He was completely dead.
- 6) Jesus Christ was raised back to life. His life-less body came alive again.
- 7) God raised Jesus Christ from death to life.

I'd better stop here. I consider these claims (at least within God's Church) to be generally accepted tenets of our faith. These are the basics. To some extent, there's not a whole lot here. Nevertheless, anything more may be claiming in excess of what we genuinely can claim.

Next, I must warn you. I fear I may be about to violate the major contention which I just advanced. Ha!

For me, though, there is one thing more. Note that I ended my list where I did, because this next thing is more of a "belief" than it is a claim which can be backed up. As I say, this is a slippery slope which can all too easily slide into what could be described as "speculation."

Together then, friends, you and I must be aware. I may not be able to substantiate what I'm about to declare next. Even so, here goes. I believe that the Resurrection is God's message to creation that "God loves all life." The Resurrection of human Jesus of Nazareth expresses that God loves human life. It is my own personal expansion of the message broadening it from "God loves humankind" to "God loves all life." So, you see, now I myself am verging on making my own unsubstantiated claims! Look out! That's how tricky this can be. It's difficult to stop at the basics which we do know. We tend not to stop soon enough. And I'm guilty, too.

Finally then, what does the Resurrection mean for this world? What is God's Resurrection message to us who


