As I compose this church newsletter reflection, the Lenten Season is perking right along. Each year during this sacred season, you and I devote much effort to growing in our relationship with God. We aspire to deepen our personal spirituality while striving to be active followers of Jesus Christ. This is hugely ambitious. Walking in the Way of Christ is demanding, sometimes exhausting, forever hopeful.

Eight years ago, a friend spontaneously gave me a small, tasteful wooden plague which offers me this precious message every time I look at it: "Good morning, this is GOD... I will be handling all your problems today."

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in God." (Romans 15:13)

Regrettably, in this day and age, when people are asked whether or not we are hopeful about the future, many respond, "Nope." This must disappoint God. How sad. In truth, we must admit that every last one of us experiences moments when we verge on echoing (or, in fact, when we do echo) this response.

In his book O me of little faith—True Confessions of a Spiritual Weakling, author Jason Boyett writes, "Do you want to progress toward faith in God?... Listen to Jesus: 'Ask and it will be given to you;

seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; those who seek find; and to those who knock, the door will be opened.' (Matthew 7:7-8)

I memorized this verse as a kid in Sunday school... But until I began thinking about this book, I never realized the uncertainty implied in this passage: Ask. Seek. Knock. Jesus describes the spiritual life—a life lived in pursuit of God—with three words that evoke the ideas of searching and mystery. You only ask when you have a question. You only seek when something is missing, or when it's not readily apparent. You only knock on a door when you're on the outside trying to get in. And vet these are the things Jesus tells his audience to do. Is Jesus aware that a relationship with God is wracked with uncertainty? Is he acknowledging that doubt is central to the pursuit of God? Maybe. Jesus said, after all, that those who ask will receive. Those who seek will find. Those who knock will be greeted with an open door. That's encouraging stuff, because I can rest in the fact that Jesus promises some kind of resolution to the uncertainty. But what he doesn't promise is a timeline... When we are deliberate in searching for where God has been, we'll see God's activity in

surprising places... I doubt God's existence more often than I'd like.... But despite the confusion, my goal is to keep the search active, and I rest in the hope that my continued searching, in itself, contains a mustard seed's worth of faith. I'd rather risk seeing my hopes get dashed than to choose no hope at all. I'd rather spend my life looking for evidence of God-even if finding it is a struggle-than to conclude before starting that there's nothing to see.... A few surprises every now and then make it all the more meaningful when I do catch a glimpse of the Almighty.... I've become accustomed to this road. Its twists and turns no longer seem so surprising or its potholes so jarring. On the doubter's road, I'm driving under the belief-possibly hopeless, but *hopefully possible*—that it leads me somewhere. Somewhere holy."

Here is a worthy vision. This is the way God encourages all of God's children to live: *Hope... always hope.*

The basis for this is the life, death and resurrection of Christ.

"For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God... For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience." (Romans 8:14, 24-25)

"Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of prophecies given by God. There are many divine prophecies concerning the "Anointed One"—the Messiah of God. Many of these prophecies date from long before the birth of Christ. In addition, certain prophecies are spoken by Christ Jesus himself. The most notable ones are Jesus foretelling that he will be betrayed, arrested, beaten, and killed. Sometimes these are described as "passion predictions." In the Church, the word "passion" is a synonym for "suffering." The 2004 feature film <u>The Passion of the Christ</u> correctly employs this term "passion" in a Good Friday sense.

Among numerous versions and translations of the Bible, I possess a personal copy of one that is a flowing prose edition of the NIV (New International Version). It is entitled <u>The Story</u>. In addition to its distinctive title, the cover of this Bible is graced by artwork uniquely depicting the fullness of Christ's ministry. The design is that of a Royal Crown with a "shadow" underneath it. Thank You...

So as you may remember in last note, month's l've been thinking a lot about how God is still speaking. Last month, I was more focused on how God is still speaking to me. This month. I've found myself



The "shadow" is not the outline of the Royal Crown, though. The "shadow" is in the shape of a Crown of Thorns. What a marvelous image! I love this duality. It is so fitting, because much double-entendre occurs throughout the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

From the Park Avenue Christian Church in New York City, Rev. Kaji Dousa declares, "I believe death is always paired with resurrection. I also believe, at the point of death, we have a vision. We see everything we need to about God and life and beauty, and every broken bit of us is made whole. The Church calls this the beatific vision." The complete story of Jesus of Nazareth as God's Messiah encompasses the entirety of Christ's life, death and resurrection.

Hope... always hope.

Christians are God's "resurrection people."

Our hope is in Christ's Resurrection,

Trustees

Well, Frank called all the Trustees six weeks ago and told us it's time to get up and get going. All the trustees told Frank that "he saw his shadow"; so, we could have another six weeks of rest. Unfortunately, times up and we all must get up and get started.

The biggest project for March has been, reclaiming the lower parking lot. Honeysuckle and vines have been cut back along the hillside ridge. **Earl Kreder** brought in his front load tractor to roll the large timber parking barricades. He cleared and removed debris and reset timbers. (*thank you*, Earl for all your help on the lower lot) The parking lot was scraped and the dirt around the playground fence was graded. As well, 20 tons of gravel was purchased, delivered (\$275.00) and spread north of the playground fence to the existing asphalt base. This remedied the large muddy area surrounding the playground entrance. Now, there is acceptable parking and entry for Ivy Chapel and CCP. The old underground drain pipe was removed and relocated to provide better drainage from the retention pond.

Conversations are underway to discuss and develop emergency plans regarding intruders either during the weekdays or during Sunday services. Please contact a trustee with any thoughts or suggestions you may have.

Because we anticipated rainy weather we cancelled our first 1st "Workday" (Supposed to have been Sat., March 24). A re-schedule date is yet to be determined.
