By the grace of God

The Christian Lenten journey is a blessed opportunity for would-be followers of Christ (by the way, this includes you and me and all human beings) to devote ourselves to a deeper, closer relationship with God. When we think about this, the one in the God-human relationship who has room for improvement is us. Of course, this is true, because God already is totally invested in God's relationship with people (indeed, with all creation!). First of all, God is God. Secondly, God is and always will be 'fully present' to us. So, if there is a 'failure' of any kind, it is on our part; that is, the human partner in covenant relationship with the Divine. God is aware of this. Yet God continues encouraging human beings to open ourselves more and more to receiving God's presence. God yearns for us to do this. We remember that once a deaf man was brought to our Savior, and Jesus commanded the man's ears, "Ephphatha! Be opened!" Immediately, the man's ears were opened, and he was able to hear and to speak. (Mark 7:32-35)



Along the way to Resurrection Day, this 40-day wilderness Journey

provides us with opportunities galore for spiritual reflection about the universe and leads us to ask probing questions, such as, "Are there ways that I am not making myself faithfully and completely available to God?" This is merely one of zillions of questions which Lent may prompt us to ask ourselves.

As you and I continue forging ahead on our current Lenten journey, let us consider in depth, "Are there ways that I may seek to become more 'open' to God? What are they? And, with God's help, will I begin attempting to do them? Starting now?"

This Christian Church season has unlimited potential as a time for learning, growing and changing. A major aspect of devotion to God during Lent is prayer. As Father Henri Nouwen writes in his book Here and Now, "Prayer is a discipline of the moment. When we pray, we enter into the presence of God whose name is God-with-us. To pray is to listen attentively to the One who addresses us **here and now**... This is a very hard challenge because radical trust in God is not obvious...Jesus' core message

Take heart, beloved.... Resurrection Day is on the way. Soon this Lenten journey will culminate in a joyous celebration of Christ's Resurrection!

was that God is neither a powerless weakling nor a powerful boss, but a lover whose only desire is to give us what our hearts most desire."

Words which greet everyone who enters Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ this Lenten Season appear in large, white letters reaching out to us from the purple background of a banner on the entryway wall: **Return to the Lord with all your heart.**

This is one emotion-packed, powerful thought. Pause, and consider the import of this ambition. Oh, to return to God fully! How complete would my "turning" need to be for me to return to God with all my being? All? Really?! Considering the full magnitude of this causes me to wonder out loud as some people who were near Jesus once did, "Then who can be saved?" (Luke 18:26)

Return to the Lord with all your heart. What sort of return could this be? All means everything. Total. The whole enchilada. Can I truly give God 100%? And, if I can, then how come I never do?

"Yet even now, says the LORD, 'Return to me with all your heart.'" (Joel 2:12) This Scripture is one of the readings commonly read at the outset of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Remarkably, God eternally offers us another chance. "Come back," God invites.

In her brilliant, spiritual anthology, *Inviting God In*, Joyce Rupp reflects, "Every Lent I look again into my heart to discover those places that have not yet returned to the One who calls me. This is the wisdom behind having a Lenten journey each year. Knowing that I will be re-invited to return to God keeps me from being discouraged as I struggle to give more of myself to this loving Creator. What does it mean to 'return'? Re-turning indicates that I have been there, that I am making a shift, turning around and heading there again. I cannot re-turn to a place where I have not already been. I find this thought very comforting because I know that if I go to the very depths of my being, I belong totally to God. Some places of my heart have strayed and lost their way, but I know they can return to God. Lent is a time to go looking for those places. Lent is also a time to remember God's invitation stands forever. Always God waits for us to return with all our heart."

Joyce Rupp entitles this reflection "A Wholehearted Return," and I just love her prayer at the conclusion:

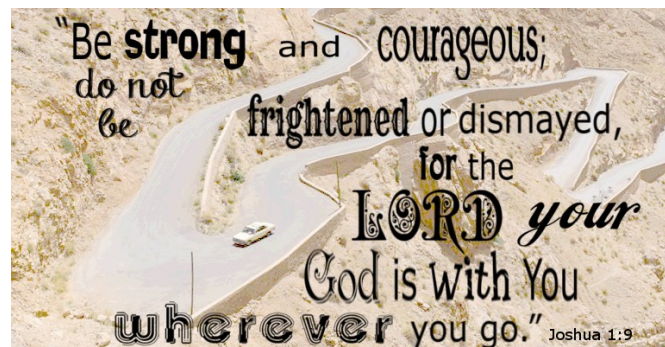

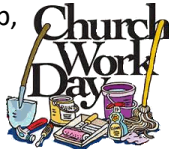


...he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. After that, he poured water into a basin and
