Without Exception

The wisdom of Holy Scripture reveals the *goodness* of God.

"Partiality in judging is not good." (Proverb 24:23)

"To show partiality is not good." (Proverb 28:21)

A man ran up to Jesus, and bowed down.., and said to him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit life eternal?"

Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone." (Mark 10:17-18)

"For God shows no partiality." (Romans 2:11)

Once some interrogators sent by Pharisees to trap Jesus said to him, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality." (Matthew 22:16)

In Caesarea, Simon Peter proclaimed, "I truly understand that God shows no partiality." (Acts 10:34)

All of us have certain people in life that we're "partial to." Yet from the Scriptures, one clearly sees that Christ teaches us not to show favoritism. While this is extremely difficult, it is our calling from the Son of God. people as God treats people. God regards and treats all people the same. How can this be? It seems impossible, doesn't it?

This validates the declaration, "God is God." The psalmist proclaims, "You are great and you do wondrous things! You alone are God!"

By Jesus' side, greatly astounded disciples said to one another, "Then who can be saved?"

Jesus answered, "For mere mortals it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God!" (Mark 10:27)

Without exception, God is love. "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God... for *God is love.*" (1 John 4:7-8)

During my personal prayers this morning, I was blessed to discover God speaking to me through a devotional reading that invites us to ask ourselves, *"How would our lives be different if we regarded others as God alive among us?"*

Indeed, God is alive among us and within us. God is alive in all human beings. God lives within all of us collectively and within every one of us individually.

The spiritual devotion with which I began this day

Regard people as God regards people. Treat

concludes with the following prayer: "God, you create all people in your image. I am aware that this includes me, and people who are like me, and people who are not like me. Help me, God, to see everyone as a person you love. Amen."

One of God's challenges to all people is for us to live affirming and treasuring and celebrating every person for who they are. **God loves without exception!** This astonishing ideal is developed by Philip Gulley and James Mulholland in their book <u>If Grace Is True</u> (2003). These two pastors write of eternal salvation for all. Long disturbed by the Church's struggle between offering both love and rejection, Gulley and Mulholland express what they believe God wants from us and for us: grace for everyone.

The Apostle Paul wrote of Christ Jesus conveying this to him in these words, "My grace is sufficient for you." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

Once again, I invite you to consider with me the stirring question from my morning devotion: *"How would our lives be different if we regarded others as God alive among us?"* Here's how. This would bring about a life-changing, life-giving re-birth of human soul! *Our lives* would change. *God's whole world* would change! Thank you, Christ Jesus, for your universal, free gift! Grace for everyone... no exceptions!

WHO WAS HOSEA?

In Hebrew, Hosea means Salvation.

Hosea was the one of the 12 Minor Prophets and lived during the 8th century Before Christ. He preached for 30 years in Israel, just before the death of Jeroboam II. Not long after that the Assyrians conquered Israel.

While Hosea was mostly considered a "prophet of doom"—speaking and condemning of corrupt and mingling of spiritual and political entities, their bureaucracies and alliances together and with other nations—see chapter 7 of Hosea.

As we have seen with other prophets, God uses the prophet an his family as examples of the good and evil in mankind. Of how they come to rely on themselves to their destruction. Yet through Hosea, God also gives hope to His people.

"Yet the number of the people of Israel shall be like the sand of the sea, which can be neither measured nor numbered; and in the place where it was said to them, "You are not my people," it shall be said to them, "Children of the living God." The people of Judah and the people of Israel shall be gathered together,..." Hosea 1:10-11a

"I will heal their disloyalty; I will love them freely, for my anger has turned from them.:" Hosea 14:4

Trustees

Even in the dog days of summer, work continues at Ivy Chapel. The new roof installed in late spring didn't take; it leaked and ruined ceiling tiles in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. That roof was replaced once again (at roofer's expense). All ceiling tiles in Fellowship Hall and damaged ceiling tile in the Narthex have been replaced. Some issues with the current roof have developed and are being dealt with on case by case basis.

An additional leak, not related to the roof, is the east stairwell landing. The lower drywall section has been removed and repair of the abutting foundation walls has been completed. Also attributing to this stairwell leak were leaking steel gutters (rusted through in many spots). These two Memorial Garden gutter runs have been replaced. After the next couple substantial rains, if all is dry, we will seal up and paint the stairwell landing area.

A dead birch tree in the front lawn area has been cut down and removed. Thank you Earl Kreder, Jack Molyneaux and Tom Glenn. As always, significant time and energy on the part of many people has been spent simply keeping up with the routine chores.
