This year marks the 60th anniversary of the birth of the United Church of Christ. Our fascinating, peculiar denomination came into being June 25, 1957. We celebrate that the United Church of Christ can be anyone's church. We seek to be a **united and uniting** church. In 1987, United Theological Seminary Professor, the Rev. Dr. Louis H. Gunnemann, praised the UCC for aspiring to ever-fresh, loving perspectives in his book **United and Uniting.**

On January 18, 2017, the UCC released an important, new video entitled **Trading Places**.

Here is a partial transcript: "The message for today

is about faith in God. Our beliefs are brought to life through love and compassion for our neighbor, peace and kindness. It is our commitment to the Ten Commandments...the importance of marriage and the family...that we demonstrate our love for God, through sacrifice and prayer, and we heed the call for charity and social justice."


