Fresh Charisma!

A new year is dawning. This beginning offers renewed promise for every individual child of God, and this offers renewed promise for God's whole Church!

The Rev. Marty Swan is a musician as well as a UCC pastor. Many years ago, Rev. Swan composed a pep song for Christ's Church entitled <u>People of Promise</u>. This song invites God's people to arise and live with zest! Here's what you and I are encouraged to do:

People of promise, arise and see. There's a new day a-dawnin' for you and for me. For God in Christ Jesus has set us all free! People of promise, arise!

Last autumn, God instilled within some believers a precious insight. I was blessed to be among those in a small group where this occurred. At the September 28th Fall Meeting of our St. Louis Association, all participants were asked to divide into mixed, small groups. Then, within those groups, everyone was invited to respond to this question: What does your congregation need to be **the Church**? [Notice that the question asked was not, What does your congregation need to be "<u>a</u> church"?]

The definite article "the" was selected intentionally, and the word Church was capitalized intentionally. We were being asked about "being **the Church**;" in other words, "being **God's Church**." This is a highly particular question, because **God's Church** is the Church of the whole, wide world.

The small group that I was part of enthusiastically took turns reacting to this question in popcorn fashion; that is, everyone chimed in at some point. One partner in Christ named James offered an intriguing, ambitious response that has stuck with me. James expressed, "What we need is **'fresh charisma!'**"

My sense is that this indeed is a gift that would be a blessing for every part of the Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ faith community. We could use some **'fresh charisma!'** Who couldn't?! Send it on down, God. And while you're at it, God, please give us eyes to see, and ears to hear, and souls to embrace your **charisma** revealed!

Ivy Chapel UCC, what faithful, future actions may we attempt?

During the upcoming calendar year, you and I will be given another opportunity to model the behavior of early Christians who asked, "What should we do?" (Luke 3:10,12,14 and Acts 2:37)

Traditionally, the month of January is a prime occasion for people to make New Year's resolutions. What a fitting time this would be for

our Ivy Chapel UCC faith community to pray that God will grant us a "Vision" for the year ahead. There's even a ready-made name for this waiting in the wings! We could call it "**20/20 Vision**."

This faith Vision will not be "our" vision so much as it will be "**God's Vision**" for Ivy Chapel UCC. As Holy Scripture emphasizes, God is "perfect." (Matthew 5:48) Jesus Christ is described as "perfect" multiple times in Chapters 2, 5, 7, 9, 10 and 12 of the Letter to the Hebrews. Similarly, a future Vision which God provides for our congregation and for the world will be "perfect." (1 John 2:3 and 5) Yes, **God has 20/20 Vision!**

As we have experienced being **loved** by God (1 John 4:19)



and being **freed** by God (John 8:32-36); we are moved to **love** and to **free** others. In this way, our relationship with Christ Jesus inspires us to put into practice our Savior's lifestyle. As Jesus declares, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life." (John 14:6)

Jesus sent out the twelve disciples with these instructions: "Go to the lost sheep... As you go, proclaim the good news... cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. **Freely you have received; freely give**." (Matthew 10:5-8) Children of God live as joyful, grateful people. Children of God are "people of promise!" Children of God **give freely**. "From Christ's fullness we all have received, grace upon grace." (John 1:16)

So, in the new year, perhaps this modest "chapel of disciples" may create and implement a mission statement (a new vision) that, with God's help, we will attempt to bring to life.

This could be as simple as:

Be God's Church Celebrating joy Giving away Growing love

Or it could be: 2020 Vision Serving God above all Offering a world of love to all

These are merely two examples. There is such abundant faith and creativity among this lovely, little chapel community. I'm confident that together we can

IVY CHAPEL CHURCH BY-LAWS

LEARNING ABOUT COUNCIL/BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

ARTICLE X - BOARD OF CHURCH AND MINISTRY

Section 2 - Responsibilities

The Board is responsible for encouraging a wholesome and effective relationship between the minister(s) and other members of the congregation. The Board shall act as liaison between the minister(s) and the congregation and, if necessary, attempt to resolve any problems or misunderstandings between them.

If there is more than one ordained minister, the Board shall define, in writing and communicate to each the duties and responsibilities of each professional staff member. The Board is responsible for clarifying any misunderstandings between staff members as to their role in the church.

The Board will help the minister(s) develop goals and establish priorities to fulfill their responsibilities....

If necessary, the Board will be part of the Search Committee.

Section 3 - Meetings

The Board shall meet with the minister(s) as needed, but at least once every three months. The Board shall meet with each minister individually at least twice per year. Additional meetings are at the discretion of the minister(s) or any Board member.


