This morning, on live radio, I heard, "We're living in a time when *truth* is under siege."

What did the speaker who claimed this mean? I believe she meant that 21st Century humankind is living through a famine.

There's a famine going on?! Here on this continent? In our homeland?

You say that you weren't aware of this? You're not alone.

Many are un-aware.

People are hungry. The hunger I'm referring to is not physical hunger. To be sure, there are people throughout the good ol' U. S. of A. (and across North America as a whole) who are suffering from physical hunger. That is tragic; and these words are in no way intended to minimize that tragedy. No, we must not sweep under the rug the present-day, telling ordeal of physically malnourished children of God anywhere.

Yet an overwhelming majority of North Americans do have adequate food to eat; food for the physical body.

For purposes of this church newsletter piece, the starvation of which I speak—the famine that is not apparent much of the time—this is a "spiritual" starvation.

Yes, people truly are hungry. People are starving. Human souls are starving for a relationship with God.

There's a stirring video named "Trading Places" which was released by our cutting-edge United Church of Christ early this year. I have spoken of it during worship. This stirring video features an emam, a rabbi and a priest. They are, of course, clergy of three different faiths (Islamic, Jewish, and Christian). All three of these clergy are proclaiming very similar teachings: "The message for today is about faith in God. Our beliefs are brought to life through love and compassion for our neighbor. Peace... and kindness... it is our commitment... that we demonstrate our love for God... through sacrifice and prayer. And we heed the call for charity and social justice."

WHO WAS THAT AGAIN?

"That very night Belshazzar, the Chaldean king, was killed. And Darius the Mede received the kingdom, being about sixty-two years old."


For years Darius (c.550-486 BC) had aspired, conspired and probably cheated to advance himself and eventually become king of Persia (Now Traditionally known as Iran or "Land of the Aryans." Not until 1935 was the name "Iran" made official). His hold on the throne lasted for 36 years, from c. 522 to 486 and consisted of 23 countries. Although ruthless, he was able to rule the vast population concurred countries through a trusted military, stable economy and a good legal system.

In the last three years of his life he was still dreaming and planning to conquer Greece but became ill and died sometime in October of 486 BC

The Bible shows us how Darius plays a part in God's plan in Daniel 5:30-6:28. He is also and mentioned in Daniel 9:1, 11:1; Haggai 1:1, 2:1, 10; Zechariah 1:1, 7, 7:1 then defeated by Alexander the Great in 1 Maccabees 1:1.
