This could pass for the name of a newly released Givenchy women's perfume or men's cologne. It's not. But the name does have the type of flashy, one -word appeal so often given to naming fragrances, cars, and other products!

Indeed, the celebrated French distiller Le Courvoisier does have a high-end liqueur called *"L'Essence de Courvoisier Cognac."* Plus, just a few years back, parent company Coty actually did introduce a men's fragrance named *"David Beckham—The Essence."* Well, what do you know?!

"Essence"... it is defined as "the intrinsic nature or indispensable quality of something, especially something abstract, that determines its character." The root of the word "essence" is the Latin verb "esse," meaning "to be, or to exist."

Thousands of other seminarians and I once enrolled in the "World Philosophy" course which the Rev. Dr. Allen Miller taught for decades at Eden Theological Seminary. Dr. Miller was renowned for his charts! He distributed paper copies of multiple charts as teaching aides each and every class session. One core truth which his students learned from Dr. Miller is that virtually every philosopher down through time has configured their system around the *"esse"* of human nature. From André Malraux (La Condition humaine) to Paul Tillich (The New <u>Being</u>, and <u>The Courage to Be</u>) and beyond; philosophical writers have centered their work around the concept of "being."

The *"essence"* of Lent is the *"essence"* of Christian faith. The *"essence"* of Christian faith is a journey. Lent is a particular, spiritual journey which is a season for growing closer to God as Resurrection Day draws closer.

Lyrics from one time-honored hymn faithfully sum this up:

"Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer to Thee. E'en thought it be a cross That raiseth me; Still all my song shall be, Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer, my God, to Thee, Nearer to Thee."

Beloved, soon the Church's Lenten Season will be underway. Together, may all God's children open ourselves to receiving God's astonishing grace as we enter into an ever-deeper relationship with our

Loving Creator God.



<u>C</u>ompanion <u>A</u>cknowledge loss/pain/anger <u>R</u>emember <u>E</u>mpathize

Be a <u>C</u>ompanion while <u>A</u>cknowledging, <u>R</u>emembering, and <u>E</u>mpathizing with others as we journey through life's challenges, such as: aging, moving to a new home, a different workplace, strained relationships, divorce, retirement, health issues, death, and other major life changes. Your companions will be **Ann Molyneaux** and **Pastor Dan**. We'll gather once every two weeks beginning on Monday morning, March 11th at 10am. As a mutual support group, every participant will be serving as a companion to every other participant. Lent, in the Christian church, a period of penitential preparation for Easter. In Western churches it begins on Ash Wednesday, six and a half weeks before Easter, and provides for a 40-day fast



(Sundays are excluded), in imitation of Jesus Christ's fasting in the wilderness before he began his public ministry. In Eastern churches Lent begins on the Monday of the seventh week before Easter and ends on the Friday that is nine days before Easter. This 40-day "Great Lent" includes Saturdays and Sundays as relaxed fast days.

A period of preparation and fasting likely has been observed before the Easter festival since apostolic times, though the practice was not formalized until the First Council of Nicaea in 325ce. It was a time of preparation of candidates for baptism and a time of penance for sinners. In the early centuries fasting rules were strict, as they still are in Eastern churches. One meal a day was allowed in the evening, and meat, fish, eggs, and butter were forbidden. The Eastern church also restricts the use of wine, oil, and dairy products. In the West, these rules have gradually been relaxed. The strict law of fasting among Roman Catholics was dispensed with during World War II, and only Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are now kept as Lenten fast days. Emphasis on penitential practice and almsgiving remains, and meatless fast on Fridays during Lent are often observed. Some Catholics and Christians choose to give up specific pleasures during Lent as a way to foster simplicity and self-control; many use their



cravings or desires for these items as a reminder to pray and to refocus on spiritual matters.

In the Anglican churches *The Book of Common Prayer* prescribes that Lent be observed with fasting. In Lutheran

and other Protestant churches Lent is observed with various services and practices.
