ast month, we reflected together on "devotion to God." As I am composing this reflection piece, the Christian Church is on the threshold of the 2020 Lenten Season. By the time you are reading this, Lent will have begun. This season of the Church Year serves as an extended period of time for disciples to deepen our relationship with God. The Season of Lent is a prime occasion for deepening devotion.

Lent is a time of preparation for Easter Sunday. It is the stretch of time which runs from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. The length of the season is 40 days.

Historically, a conventional approach to Lent involved each Christian "sacrificing" (that is, giving up) some valued aspect of personal life for the duration of the season. This stemmed from observing Lent as "a time of

prayer and fasting." Indeed, the name for "Lent" in German is "Fastenzeit," meaning "time of fasting." The basis for these practices is biblical. Holy Scripture speaks of "fasting and praying before God" in many places (including Judges, First Samuel, Second Samuel, First Kings, First Chronicles, Second Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Psalms, Isaiah, Daniel, Joel, Jonah, Zechariah, Matthew, Mark, Luke, Acts).

Engaging in spiritual practices such as prayer and fasting is viewed as an expression of devotion to God. From its inception, the Lenten Season was intended to be a time for believers to prepare for the Church's pinnacle high, holy day - Christ's Resurrection Day. Nevertheless, the focus during Lent is not meant to be "Easter," or "fasting," or any "sacrifice" of ours. The intent is for people to focus on "God in Christ Jesus."

Lent is a season of discipline which calls us away from self-indulgence. Lent urges humankind to turn away from sin and to turn toward God. This sacred time of spiritual discipline has unbounded

potential for becoming a transformative **turning point** in our lives! "For many of us the question is, how do we arrive at peace with God? The answer,...given in the testimonial of Ezekiel, is to **turn away from** transgression... [In Ezekiel 18], the

prophet details three dimensions of the **turn to God**: first, reject idolatry... Second, reject exploitative sexuality that treats others as objects rather than persons. Third, reject economic exploitation that regards neighbors as usable commodities... The relentless insistence of the Bible is that peace with God depends on right

neighborly conduct." (Walter Brueggemann, <u>Gift and Task</u>, Westminster John Knox Press, 2017)

Glory be! Moses went up Mount Sinai, and the glory of God settled on the mountain as a cloud. The cloud covered the mountain. On the seventh day, God called to Moses out of the cloud. To the people Israel below, the glory of God looked like a blazing fire on top of the mountain. At last, Moses climbed the rest of the way up to the top of the mountain and entered the cloud. Moses remained there forty days and forty nights. (Exodus 24:15-18) Similar to the 40 days of rain in the time of Noah, this length of time is regarded as exceptionally holy.

It is and it always has been impossible to describe precisely what the glory of God looks like. "... Jesus is the Christ appearing among us to reveal God's love, and the Church is God's people called together to make God's presence visible in today's world. Would we have recognized Jesus as the Christ if we had met him many years ago? Are we able to recognize him today in his body, the Church? We are asked to make a leap of faith. If we dare to do it, our eyes will be opened and we will see the glory of God." (Henri Nouwen, Bread for the Journey, HarperCollins, 1997) God "appears" in unique ways to each human being, and biblical use of the term "glory" is simply an attempt to describe the appearance of God. There's certainly nothing wrong with giving this a try. Ultimately, though, the totality of God is indescribable.

Words of the Apostle Paul offer us direction, "The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:5b-6) Have faith. Be at peace. "Come to prayer with no other expectations. Be empty and expectant. It is not up to you to manufacture the light; all you have to do is open your protective shutters and raise the blinds... prayer is an opening of the self, making a place for God in your day and in your soul, and inviting God into that opening." (William O'Malley, Meeting the Living God, Paulist Press, 1998) Truly, God is near.

What will your personal, Lenten discipline be? "Discipline in the spiritual life is the concentrated effort to create space and time where God can become our Master and where we can respond freely to God's guidance," writes Henri Nouwen. "Thus, discipline is the creation of boundaries that keep time and space open for God. Solitude requires discipline, worship requires discipline, caring for others requires discipline. They all ask us to set

apart a time and a place where God's gracious presence can be acknowledged and responded to." (Henri Nouwen, <u>Bread for the Journey</u>, HarperCollins, 1997) Living as a Christian disciple requires discipline. Choose a discipline. Practice it. Give yourself and God room to bond. Invite God into your personal space. Open up. Be patient. Remain open to any manner in which this unfolds.

In his song "Redemption," Bryan Sirchio sings,
"Some fall back and some fall forward. Some fall
in and some fall out. Some keep falling for some
kind of con job, and some fall deep into doubt.
But if you feel like you've fallen somehow forever
out of place. If you've hit bottom so hard, it feels
like you must have fallen from grace. It just might
help to look at the cross. And see how far love will
reach to lift you up and set you back on your feet.
You cannot fall so far away that God will stop
reaching. You cannot fall so far away that God
will stop reaching for you. God is reaching for
you."

Well, yea, but now we are being forced out of our house. We thought we would have the ability to wait until we find a house to move into, but apparently, that isn't the case. However, it ended up being more than we wanted to spend, but we thought we could swing it. Then, the inspections get back. LEARNING ABOUT COUNCIL/BOARDS AND COMMITTEES




HIGHWAY CLEAN-UP

Baby Blue Pantry

This year our special Lenten offerings are dedicated solely to Baby Blue Pantry, a free resource for families in the Festus area who need help with baby food and supplies. "Anyone, any time is welcome to take what they need. We want to help families that need a 'wee' bit more," says Wee Care Learning Center director Kathy Poss.

Established by center staff in 2017, the pantry is stocked twice a day but is often empty just before pay days. "If we can fill a baby's tummy with formula or help with diapers or bath needs, we feel like what we're doing is worthwhile," Kathy continues.

Although they don't know the number of families who benefit from the pantry, they know this outreach is greatly needed and appreciated by communities in that area.
