



THE GREAT FIFTY DAYS

Our Savior spoke of himself in many ways, frequently employing what are described as Jesus' "I am" Sayings.

Only a short time ago, on the final Sunday in April, our Gospel for the day was a passage from John 10, where Jesus twice refers to himself, stating, "I am the good shepherd."

By his peers in the National Hockey League, former Edmonton Oiler and St. Louis Blue Wayne Gretzky was given the nickname "The Great One."

Many of today's older adults remember 20th century heavyweight boxer Muhammad Ali espousing himself as "The Greatest." Mixed in with juicy, poetic taunts (i.e., "float like a butterfly; sting like a bee!") directed at his next boxing opponent, Ali punctuated pre-fight weigh-in's and press conferences with one classic pronouncement: "I am the greatest!"

By contrast, our Savior Jesus tends toward humility rather than arrogance. Jesus' words regarding "greatness" come across more as a cautionary teaching instead of a pep talk urging people to brag.

"A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was the greatest." (Luke 22:24)

that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many." (Mark 10:42-45)

The Church is now in smack dab in the middle of the peak season in our life of faith. The stretch of time between Resurrection Day and Pentecost Day is the Christian Church Season of Easter. This time is known as *"The Great Fifty Days."*

So here we are, my friends. In some sense, we are "milking" Christ's Resurrection for all it's worth. And why not?! Is there anything greater?

No one—inside of or outside of God's Church—can top the Day of days—Easter Sunday! From my seminary days, I recall Liturgy Class instilling within us that every worship service is "a little Easter." What an uplifting Christian vision: Every time of worship truly is intended to be a resurrection celebration! Think of it! Each time we go to church, you and I are letting loose with an Easter Alleluia!

So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know

mistakes over and over again.... What is true-and more powerful than our never-ending opposition to the Holy Spirit—is God's grace toward us. We stand in need of redemption. Thank goodness God possesses an endless supply of mercy and grace, and is always ready to give us far more than we deserve, ask for, or could imagine."

"I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Now to the One who by the power at work within us is able to do far more than all we can ask or imagine, to God be the glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen." (Ephesians 3:18-21)

Rector Halley muses, "I wonder if we make enough space in our lives to experience holiness. Our lives are much easier if we hold God and other things that require vulnerability at arm's length... But the work of God breaches our surest defenses with a relentless, take-no-prisoners love. In the very places we feel most secure, God will surprise us by walking through and extending an invitation to new life. Surprise is God's way of disarming us, helping us to be vulnerable enough to consider a different way forward."

Beloved, may you and I relish the remaining days of this sacred Easter Season. May each of us open ourselves to the marvelous surprises which God is offering everyone who is willing to become a vulnerable recipient of grace. My sisters and brothers in Christ, let us cap off this Easter Celebration seeking to live by the exhortation of the Desiderata:

"Go placidly amid the noise and haste, and remember what peace there may be in silence.

Where: Appalachia Service Project, Knott County Location, Hazard, Kentucky **When:** June 24 – 30






On March 29th Chesterfield Police Department visited Ivy Chapel, walked the facility and grounds in order to perform a "Facility Security Assessment". It was determined that Ivy Chapel is a very solid facility, both structurally and procedurally! The assessment report provided one to three recommendations, under eight different categories inspected. These recommendations were taken to Council for discussion and possible action. Perhaps the most important note was to further develop an "All-Hazard Crisis Response Plan". This will provide us an opportunity to fine tune, existing; fire, severe weather, tornado and earthquake procedures, documents and maps. Vulnerabilities to be addressed may include responses for intruder(s) and active shooter(s). This is a work in progress. More information to come. 🕫
