Running On Empty

We are familiar with many Gospel stories. By this point in our lives, we have heard and read many Scriptures about the life of Jesus of Nazareth. Among the biblical stories which we know best are the Gospel accounts of Resurrection Day.

Each of the four Gospels tells the story in a unique manner. What they have in common is that each Gospel, in its own fashion, describes how disciples reach the tomb, discover the stone rolled away and Jesus' body gone, and then **run** from the scene.

Jesus' followers go to the tomb, find it empty, become afraid, and **run**! This is the way Resurrection Morn is remembered in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. They discover the tomb not full, but **empty**. And they skedaddle.

Specifically, in the **Gospel of Matthew**, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to the tomb. There was an earthquake. An angel of God exclaimed, "Fear not... He is not here. He has been raised! Come, see the place where the Lord lay." So the women took a look. Next, they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and they **ran** to tell his disciples. (Matthew 28:8)

In the **Gospel of Mark**, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, very early on the first day of the week, went to the tomb. They saw the stone already rolled back. A messenger of God

was sitting there, and they were astonished. This one dressed in white invited the women: "Do not be astonished.... He has been raised! He is not here. Look, see the place where they laid him." So the women went out, and they **ran** from the tomb, ...for they were afraid. (Mark 16:8)

In the **Gospel of Luke**, on Good Friday, women, who had come with Jesus from Galilee, "saw the tomb and how his body was laid." (Luke 23:55) On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women came back to the tomb, found the stone rolled away, went in, but did not find the body. Two in dazzling clothes prompted, "Why are you looking for the living among the dead?... He is not here. He is risen! Remember how he told you..." (Luke 24:5-6) They remembered. They went and told this to the apostles. Peter **ran** to the tomb, looked in, saw the linen cloths, and went home amazed. (Luke 24:8-12)

In the **Gospel of John**, Mary Magdalene approaches the tomb. When she sees that the huge stone which previously had blocked the doorway of the tomb has been moved, Mary **runs**. She **runs** back to Simon Peter and the other disciple. (John 20:2) In response, Simon Peter and the other disciple go toward the tomb..."**running**

together..." (John 20:4) Eventually, they reach the tomb; go in; see the linen burial cloths lying there; and believe!

All of the Gospels depict Christ's followers "**running on empty!**" They take a look at the **Empty** Tomb, and they **run!** In time, all Christians become aware that the meaning of this **Empty** Tomb is **Fullness** of Life. This is one of countless ironies of God. **Emptiness signifies Fullness.**

My friends, God's Church is now living the "Great Fifty Days" of the Easter Season. As we do, may you and I and every prospective disciple everywhere prize Christ's promise of **life eternal**. (Matthew 25:26; Mark 10:30; Luke 18:30; John 4:13-14)

Let us recall the message of God's prophet: "Hear then, O house of David!... Therefore, God will give you a sign. Behold, the young woman is with child, and she will bear a son, and she will name him Immanuel." (Isaiah 7:13-14) This name Immanuel means "God-with-us."

God is with us in life.

God is with us in death.

In life, in death, in life beyond earthly death; God is with us.

Let's **run** with this: Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world forever!

Thank-you to all the folks that were able to help out on our recent work day. Many jobs on our list were completed. All your time and effort made a big difference. Thank you, again!

Although a few problems were encountered during our recent roof replacement, everything has been addressed and all roofs installed. Ivy Chapel has now re-roofed 100% of all roof surfaces including our flat roof section. Due to a couple strong storms during the roofing process, you probably noticed the significant increase in water-stained ceiling tiles. As soon as we are certain that everything is watertight, all damaged ceiling tiles will be replaced.

If you were at church on Palm Sunday, you probably noticed the small flood in our stairwell. Although water seepage through the stairwell concrete block walls has been an issue since that addition was originally constructed, holes rusted through the stairwell steel gutters has allowed a significant amount of water to super-saturate the ground outside the stairwell landing. This problem allows water that cannot be absorbed by the ground to migrate into the building. Bids have been received for new aluminum gutters and downspouts. Council has approved replacement of the problematic gutters.

A special *Thank You* to **Frank Purviance** who held the helm and persevered. Frank practically slept at Ivy Chapel for the first couple weeks in April. *Thanks, Frank!*

It's been said that God never gives us more than we can handle. April has given the Trustees a reason to question that old adage. We thank God for helping us weather the storms. Puns intended!

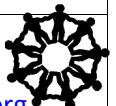
