

God's Way of living is Civing

There is a treasured line which emerged and spoke deeply to me this autumn as our faith community's stewardship venture was blossoming. This simple yet exceptionally meaningful phrase, which made a lasting impact on me, is: *God's Way of living is giving*.

Spontaneous, joyful gratitude is a trait of every genuine Christian. God *gives*, and this motivates us to *give*.

In "Church"-speak, one of the names we give to our Sacrament of Holy Communion is the "Eucharist." This term is derived from the Greek "eukharistia", meaning "thanks-giving; gratitude." The most formative influences on any group are the activities, practices, rituals in which the group regularly participates. As Christians, our character is centrally defined by joining together celebrating "Communion." There is a Communion liturgy (based on First Corinthians 10:16) which includes rhetorical questions: "The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the Body of Christ? The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the Blood of Christ?" In our tradition, the communion bread and the communion cup "represent" life-giving sacrifices which our Savior Jesus offers to the world.

As Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ, you and I are richly blessed with a God-given identity. We are people of Christ's Table; a Community of Christ; the United Church of Christ. I praise God for the path that God is leading us along. Our recent, autumnal trek has been a growing experience for our congregation as we have travelled together on a memorable journey: *Going the*

Extra Mile Is the Way.

We have received so much from God as we have engaged in accepting God's guidance on the Way. We have received strength and hope. All Christians walk a path of being continually re-shaped by God. We are and forever we will be "working on a rough draft." Growing disciples continue growing.

In Summer 1999 and again in Summer 2000, I was blessed to *participate* on trips which the parent ministry who organizes them calls "pilgrimages of reverse mission." Those two distant summers, I went to Haiti. That nation is the poorest country in the Northern Hemisphere. The places we visited and the people with whom we interacted are far different from any others I've experienced in my entire life. Those daring, Christian pilgrimages left indelible marks on my soul. Their permanent impact is a holy mixture of scars and beauty marks. Those were truly miraculous trips; Spiritblowing, eye-opening gifts of God!

"I lift my eyes to the hills—where will my help come from? My help comes from God, who made heaven and earth." (Psalm 121:1-2) Amen! Faithful, Compassionate God accompanied and carried our groups through those demanding, highly emotional, sometimes deeply upsetting ventures. It is fair to say that our volunteer efforts as Christ's ambassadors changed *us* more than it changed any Haitians! And this was the intent. As our group leader repeatedly avows, "I personally go on these trips of reverse mission 'to be bothered." Indeed, each time

that I myself went, everyone in the group definitely was bothered and troubled by the deplorable realities of daily life in Haiti to which we were exposed. For us, abject poverty now has a face. This remains with us. And always will. An awareness of present-day, dire, human need can serve as a healthy catalyst. People of God are hurting and must not be forgotten. God does not forget. God listens to the cry of the poor. (Job 34:28) God responds!

One of the ministries where we volunteered is an orphanage in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. This is a home for orphaned children. The facility is served by the Missionaries of Charity. The missionaries are a holy order which originally was started in India by Mother Teresa of Calcutta. On an inside wall of the Port-au-Prince orphanage is a framed print of these words:

ANYWAY

People are unreasonable, illogical, and self-centered, LOVE THEM ANYWAY.

If you do good, people will accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives,

DO GOOD ANYWAY.

If you are successful, you win false friends and true enemies,

SUCCEED ANYWAY.

The good you do will be forgotten tomorrow, DO GOOD ANYWAY.

Honesty and frankness make you vulnerable, BE HONEST AND FRANK ANYWAY.

What you spent years building may be destroyed overnight,

BUILD ANYWAY.

People really need help but may attack you if you help them,

HELP PEOPLE ANYWAY.

Give the world the best you have and you'll get kicked in the teeth,

GIVE THE WORLD THE BEST YOU'VE GOT ANYWAY.

Check out the magnificent verbs above: Love. Do good. Succeed. Be honest. Build. Help. Give.

Let's bring these verbs to life! Take action. I pray that our *Compassionate, 'Always-Giving-Extra' God* may frequently witness you and me living as people of *thanks-giving!*

IVY CHAPEL CHURCH BY-LAWS

LEARNING ABOUT COUNCIL/BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

ARTICLE VIII—BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Section 2—Responsibilities

The Board of Trustees shall administer and maintain the church property and make recommendations to the Council concerning needed repairs and changes.

The Board shall, in the event of needed emergency repairs exceeding the budget, contact the Moderator for action as outlined in ARTICLE IV, SECTION 3 of the By-Laws.

The Board shall be responsible for the securing of the Church Secretary, with the approval of the professional staff, and shall maintain liaison with the secretary to ensure satisfactory working relationships.

The Board shall also secure and maintain liaison with the church's custodial services.

Other responsibilities are the administration of the rental policy for the church property and the solicitation and evaluation of bids on insurance and bond coverage.

The Board will evaluate and decide upon all written requests from church organizations or individuals wishing to make alterations to the church building or to the grounds.

CHRISMONS DECORATE CHRISTMAS TREE

The Chi Rho (KEE-roe) is one of many symbols that we use as Chrismons. It's one of the earliest forms of a Christogram*, formed by the first two (capital) letters—<u>chi</u> and <u>rho</u> (<u>X</u> and <u>P</u>)—of the Greek word <u>XP</u>IΣΤΟΣ. The vertical stroke of the rho intersects the center of the chi... Ancient Greek <u>Χριστος</u> (Christos) meaning "anointed", derived from <u>χριω</u> (chrio) meaning "to anoint". This was a name applied to <u>Jesus</u> by early Greek-speaking Christians. It is a translation of the Hebrew word <u>ηιψη</u> (mashiyach), commonly in English as <u>messiah</u>, which also means

"anointed". This symbol was also used by the Roman

Emperor Constantine 1st and in pre-Christian times.
