

Come Along on the Journey



New discoveries are on the horizon. This is one refreshing, perpetual, joyous proclamation of God's people. As followers of Christ, you and I celebrate that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is an uplifting, hopegiving promise of God. It's never too late. Through Jesus Christ, we are offered a fresh start. God is steadfast. God's love never runs out; never ends. Yes, God in Christ Jesus is able "to make all things new!" This is a lofty promise; one which may, at times, come across as a seemingly preposterous claim. And yet... you and I continue receiving from God; discovering new joys and beauties as we move through this earthly life.

The season of autumn overflows with countless, magnificent phenomena. One of the peculiarities of autumn is the "homecoming football game" accompanied by an imaginative array of satellite "homecoming events." It tends to become an energizing experience that emotionally winds people up. Way beyond anything football-related, the pure notion of "homecoming" is one filled with heartwarming sentiment.

From a Christian faith perspective, returning to God is a spiritual "homecoming." Deceased UCC Pastor Tom Hunter expressed this so beautifully in a song he wrote: "Come on in from the storm. Come and listen to my song. It's the song of a lost soul coming home. Maybe you've sung it, too, when you thought that you were through and you didn't think you had anything left to do. We're comin' home; we're comin' home! With laughing tears of joy, we're coming home. Knowing everything's not gone. The nighttime has a dawn. And it sings another song - comin' home." (Tom Hunter, 1976)

There's a fascinating "domino sequence" in the last half of the first chapter of the Gospel of John. John the Baptist is in the process of passing the torch to Jesus. One day, John is baptizing disciples in the River Jordan.

The next day, Jesus of Nazareth comes to the riverbank and invites John to baptize him.

The next day, Jesus returns. John proclaims Jesus is the Lamb of God. Two of John's disciples begin tagging along after Jesus, and they ask, "Where are you going?" Jesus replies, "Come and see."

The next day, Jesus goes to Galilee to recruit his own disciples. Jesus finds Philip and invites, "Follow me." Philip finds Nathanael and tells him, "We've found the One of whom the prophets wrote - Jesus, son of Joseph." Nathanael reacts, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip replies, "Come and see."

Together, Philip and Nathanael go to Jesus. When they meet, Nathanael is astonished that Jesus

knows all about him although they have just met one another for the first time. Nathanael praises Jesus, proclaiming, "Teacher, you are the Son of God!" (John 1:24-51)

This sequence is an uplifting chain reaction. I embrace this Gospel Word as a holy message that Christ's "following" multiplies in mysterious, lovely, abundant ways. The journey begins with Jesus extending an invitation, "Come and see." Soon, Jesus' followers are extending the very same invitation to others. People accept the invitation, and the community of disciples grows!

Suddenly, here we are in the Year of our Lord 2017. You and I can do as Philip and other early disciples of Jesus Christ faithfully did. In the Spirit of our Invitational Savior, we can invite, "Come and see." Even as we ourselves are still in the process of coming and seeing, you and I can offer Christ's invitation, "Come and see."

Our Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ stewardship emphasis this autumn is "Journey to Generosity." You are invited. Accept God's invitation. May your soul be touched and moved to action by God's generosity. "From Christ's fullness, we all have received, grace upon grace." (John 1:16) "Freely you have received; freely give." (Matthew 10:8) "O the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are God's judgments and how inscrutable are God's ways!" (Romans 11:33 NRSV) "Have you ever come on anything quite like this extravagant generosity of God, this deep, deep wisdom? It's way over our heads. We'll never figure it out." (Romans 11:33 The Message)

Come along on the Journey. It can become a momentous one. Your involvement is an integral part of our church's Journey becoming momentous.

Consider this your "homecoming" invitation. Yes, you're invited! It's the song of a lost soul comin' home. Nighttime has a dawn. With laughing tears of joy, we're comin' home! There's an Eternity to discover. Come along on the Journey.

FIRE SAFETY UPDATE

The Trustees are happy to announce that Ivy Chapel is now protected by a new "monitored" fire alarm system. This is now a single, standalone alarm system for both floor levels. Although this experience proved to be complex, lengthy and exasperating, with God's grace we endured. Ivy Chapel is blessed to have a congregation, whose support and willingness to donate funds allowed us to update and improve the safety our facility.

While we were in the fire mode, we used this opportunity to evaluate Ivy with regards to fire extinguishers, exit lights and emergency lights. A few additional fire extinguishers have been purchased to replace older models. As well, six exit lights have been replaced and a few emergency lights have been added by suggestion from the Monarch Fire Inspector.

After 500 years



Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum, which means The

Word of the Lord Endures Forever. The motto of the Lutheran Reformation, a confident expression of the enduring power and authority of God's Word.

"The start of the Reformation is usually dated to Luther's nailing of his "95 Theses on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences" to the church door in Wittenberg on October 31st 1517. The "95 Theses" were propositions written in Latin that he wished to discuss, in the academic custom of the day, in an open debate at the university. Luther, then an obscure theologian and minister, was outraged by the behaviour of Johann Tetzel, a Dominican friar who was selling indulgences to raise money to fund the pet project of his boss, Pope Leo X: the reconstruction of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Hand over your money, went Tetzel's sales pitch, and you can ensure that your dead relatives are not stuck in purgatory. This crude commercialisation of the doctrine of indulgences, encapsulated in Tetzel's slogan—"As soon as the coin in the coffer rings, so the soul from purgatory springs"was, to Luther, "the pious defrauding of the faithful" and a glaring symptom of the need for broad reform. Pinning a list of propositions to the church door, which doubled as the university notice board, was a standard way to announce a public debate. "
