We are living through autumn of this calendar year, my friends. In more ways than one, you and I are living through "an autumn." One prayer which Scripture offers humankind is: "I pray that, according to the riches of God's glory, God may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through God's Spirit, and that Christ may live in your hearts through faith as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God." (Ephesians 3:16-19)

I am trying to be more joyful these days.

As with so many things, I recall being tremendously moved and emotionally inspired by Christian faith when I was a boy. The memory I have of that time is that, at a young age, I was completely taken with God and with the Gospel. Thinking back on it now, those seem like days when I was fully "into God" and when I exuded joy. My growing years were ample with pure joy.

The early phase of my life was a wondrous, joyous time! I felt so thoroughly the sentiment expressed in a hymn text (circa 1900) composed by Marie Payne Ferguson: "Joys are flowing like a river, Since the Comforter has come. He abides with us forever,

Makes the trusting heart His home... See, a fruitful field is growing, Blessed fruit of righteousness. And the streams of life are flowing In the lonely wilderness. Blessed quietness, holy quietness, what assurance in my soul! On the stormy sea He speaks peace to me. How the billows cease to roll."

Ah, yes, childhood was, for me, a largely joyous, unconflicted time.

Now that I am an adult (presumed a "grown-up"!), many times, I find myself yearning for innocence and faithfulness which came so naturally in my youth. Today, I often pine for that naiveté which I used to have. Maybe you also sometimes experience feelings like these?

With age, I perceive that I must actively resist becoming cynical and suspicious. Nowadays, I've got 'nostalgia' instead of 'naiveté'! Still, my hope is that I have acquired some additional gifts along the way that I did not display as a young boy. Over the course of this earthly journey, could it be that God is enhancing within me sensitivity, compassion, stubbornness for pursuing God's justice, wider perspective, patience, some wisdom, creativity and openness? No, I do not display all of these virtues daily. Far from it! And yet, by the grace of God, these God-given gifts do shine through in my life (God's Joy...continued from page 1)

from time to time.

So, while I have lost my boyish naiveté, God is blessing me in ever-new ways. I rejoice in this! And there it is... *God's joy!*

I have a hunch this is the "fullness" that the Apostle Paul is describing when he writes: "Grace to you and peace, from God.... In our prayers for you, we always thank God,...for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all the saints,.... You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the Gospel that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God.... May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from God's glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to God, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. God has rescued us...and transferred us into the realm of God's beloved Son.... For in Christ the whole fullness of God lives, and you have come to fullness in Christ." (Colossians 1:2-6, 11-13 and 2:9-10)

I want to live more joyfully. I know God wants me to. I'm trying. I really am.

A good friend is helping me appreciate that Christ Jesus is the One who knows my deepest pain and my greatest joy. Having Someone love me this intimately is a sacred gift. This is pure, true, full "joy." I pray that you may receive such joy.



As we look forward to a beautiful fall season, the Trustees ended the summer with a bang. Along with the normal seasonal chores, the following was also accomplished.


