Ears to hear

On multiple occasions, Jesus of Nazareth encourages, "Let anyone with ears listen." (These Scripture passages include: Matthew 11:15; 13:9; 13:43; Mark 4:23; Luke 8:8; 14:35)

You and I are living in tumultuous times. There's a lot of noise, and many voices are clamoring for our attention. With everything that is going on in our day and age, it's no wonder we have difficulty hearing God's voice. The message of the Cecil Alexander's lyrics to the hymn "Jesus Call Us O'er the Tumult" has never been more relevant than it is this very moment. Sifting through all of the commotion trying to single out the voice of God is tough.

Living and navigating through today's contentious times, you and I appreciate each genuine word of God which we can make out. This may happen when we least expect it. Yet, every once in a while, we are given "ears to hear" the true voice of God.

Through the Prophet Isaiah, God declares, "Behold, a king will reign in righteousness,... Then the eyes of those who have sight will not be closed, and the ears of those who have hearing will listen... Rise up,... hear my voice... until a Spirit from on high is poured out on us,... Then justice will dwell in the wilderness, and righteousness abide in the fruitful field. The effect of righteousness will be peace, and

the result of righteousness, quietness and trust forever. My people will abide in a peaceful habitation, in secure dwellings, and in quiet resting places." (Isaiah 32:1, 3, 9, 15-18)

"... Morning by morning, the Lord God wakens wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God helps me; therefore, I have not been disgraced... It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?" (Isaiah 50:4-5, 7, 9)

As one beloved hymn celebrates, "...Strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow, Blessings all mine, with ten thousand beside!... Morning by morning, new mercies I see; All I have needed Thy hand has provided. Great is Thy faithfulness, Lord, unto me." (Thomas Chisholm, 1923)

Aramaic was the mother tongue, the everyday language spoken by the people of biblical Palestine, including Jesus of Nazareth. There are seven places in the Gospels where Jesus is quoted speaking in Aramaic (Mark 5:41; 7:34; 11:9; 14:36; Matthew 5:22; 27:46 and John 20:16). This is an extremely small number of incidences, which makes each one of these rare occurrences highly significant.

One such situation was a time when Jesus was making his way from Sidon south toward the Sea of Galilee. People in the area brought to him a deaf

man with a speech impediment. Jesus took the man aside privately. He put his fingers in the man's ears and touched the man's tongue, saying, "Ephphatha!" (Aramaic, meaning "be opened") And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke clearly... People were astounded beyond measure; overwhelmed with amazement, exclaiming, "Jesus has done everything well! He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak!" (Mark 7:31-37)

The Way of Christ is a compassionate, gracious, loving manner of relating to all human beings. This is the "Way" which God hopes that we who are God's faith community known as Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ will live together. "Let anyone with ears listen."

Our Risen Savior longs for our ears and our eyes, our hearts and our souls to "be opened." This was true in biblical times, and it is true now.

Seeking to live as a Christian is an on-going process of challenging ourselves to open wider and wider. In his 2015 song <u>Fully Alive</u>, Bryan Sirchio sings: "I want to *open* my heart a little wider. Let Spirit in a little deeper. Love with a Love that's on fire. And be fully alive!"

LEARNING ABOUT COUNCIL/BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

ARTICLE IV—COUNCIL, Section 2—Responsibilities

The Council shall be the policy-making body and shall transact the business of the Church on behalf of the Congregation. The Council shall supervise, coordinate and assist with the activities of all boards, committees and officers. It shall make provisions for determining the Church's budget. The Council shall also require a monthly review of the financial status of the Church and the actions and/or requests of the minister(s). The Council shall resolve any questions of interpretation of the Constitution and By-Laws.



Who was the prophet Amos?

Not much is actually known about Amos. He lived during the 8th century BC as a shepherd from Tekoa (now a ruin) in the land of Judah, just outside of Bethlehem and 12 miles south of Jerusalem. This was the time of King Uzziah of Judah and King Jeroboam II of Israel. He was the first of the Hebrew prophets to have a book named after him.

His message was of God's displeasure of/and judgement on Israel for it's economic disparity, morality, environmental (yes, even then)—all of which led to collapse of the nation and forced migration—and corrupt spiritual leaders.

Amos foretold the destruction of the kingdom of Israel in Chapter Nine, verse 8. "The eyes of the Lord God are upon the sinful kingdom, and I will destroy it from the face of the earth—except that I will not utterly destroy the house of Jacob, says the LORD." Yet we learn in that same chapter that God still loved His children and had pity on them by giving the promise of Jesus in verses eleven and twelve: "On that day I will raise up the booth of David that is fallen, and repair its breaches, and raise up its ruins, and rebuild it as in the days of old; in order that they may possess the remnant of Edom and all the nations who are called by my name,..."

Pray that you and I may continue opening our ears <u>and</u> our **souls** to the lively, ever-new grace of God....
