

## STEADINESS

There is a ton of material in the Bible which speaks of the “steadfastness” of God. Many, many Scripture verses speak of God’s “steadfast love.” Hebrew is the language of the Common Covenant (aka “Old Testament”). In Hebrew, there is one word—*‘hesed’*—which is translated “steadfast love.” One of the places where we find a highly concentrated use of “steadfast love” is Psalm 136. This psalm is composed of 26 verses. Each and every verse concludes in an identical fashion with the phrase: “...for God’s steadfast love endures forever.” In the entire Book of Psalms, it is this psalm which is the epitomé of regularity. This steady-ness is characteristic of God. What is the character of the love of God? God’s love is “steadfast”—constant, reliable, unailing.

What a spectacular blessing to be children of such a God! At this time, when everything about life feels so un-steady, we appreciate more than ever our Steadfast God.

As I compose this reflection, the Day of Pentecost approaches. It is an occasion in the life of God’s Church which is directly connected with Easter. The Christian Season of Easter is called “The Great Fifty

Days.” The Season of Easter begins on Resurrection Day and lasts for 50 days. The name “Pentecost” literally means “fiftieth.” It is the holy day which is the anniversary of the coming of the Holy Spirit. (Acts of the Apostles 2:1-20)

Let’s reflect for a bit on God’s gift of the Holy Spirit. Henri Nouwen writes, “When God makes a covenant with us, God says, ‘I will love you with an everlasting love’... It is an eternal love in which we are embraced... In our society, we don’t speak much about covenants; we speak about *contracts*. When we make a *contract* with a person, we say, ‘I will fulfill my part as long as you fulfill yours. When you don’t live up to your promises, I no longer have to live up to mine.’ *Contracts* are often broken because the partners are unwilling or unable to be

faithful to their terms. But God didn’t make a *contract* with us; God made a covenant with us, and God wants our relationships with one another to reflect that covenant... The word covenant means ‘coming together.’ God wants to come together with us... When Jesus comes, a new dimension of the covenant is revealed. In Jesus, God is born, grows

to maturity, lives, suffers, and dies as we do. God is *God-with-us*. Finally, when Jesus leaves, he promises the Holy Spirit. In the Holy Spirit, God reveals the full depth of the covenant. God wants to be as close to us as our breath. God wants to breathe in us; so that all we say, think, and do is completely inspired by God. God is *God-within-us*. Thus, God's covenant reveals to us how much God loves us... When we speak about the Holy Spirit, we speak about the breath of God breathing in us. The Greek word for 'spirit' is *pneuma*, which means 'breath.' We are seldom aware of our breathing. It is so essential for life that we only think about it when there is something wrong with it. The Spirit of God is like our breath. God's Spirit is more intimate to us than we are to ourselves. We might not often be aware of it, but without it we cannot live a 'spiritual life.' It is the Holy Spirit of God who... offers us the life that death cannot destroy." (Bread for the Journey, HarperCollins, San Francisco, CA, 1997)

Hear anew the psalmist's life-giving poetry: "O Lord, you have searched me and known me... Where can I go from your Spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence?... If I say, 'Surely the darkness will cover me, and the light around me become night,' **even the darkness is not dark to you**; the night is as bright as the day, for **darkness is as light to you**." (Psalm 139:1, 11-12)

Presently, you and I are living through an exceptional stretch of time. Some people these days are very "down on" the world and just about everything in it. This is too bad. God's Word provides us with a sacred view of the world as a treasured, lovely place. This is the manner of life which Jesus models for us all. Our Savior teaches us to praise God for "this world."

There may arrive moments when we are verging on despair, moments when it feels as though God does not care. But I am here to assure you that God is not oblivious to your personal circumstances...not now, not ever. God does care. God cares deeply for you, my friend. God Eternal yearns to uplift you. A favorite campfire song from church camp is Pass It On. The closing verse celebrates: "I wish for you, my friend, this happiness that I've found. You can depend on God. It matters not where you're bound. I'll shout it from the mountain top—I want my world to know; the Lord of love has come to me, I want to pass it on!" Especially during erratic times such as this, you can depend on God. Even the darkness is not dark to God.

Long ago, prophesying to the People Israel, God said with care, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore, I have continued my faithfulness to you." (Jeremiah 31:3)

## VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL UPDATE






