Walking the Christian walk is a discipline that perpetually requires starting over. Words of a praise response which we sing in worship are ever relevant. "Spirit of the Living God, fall fresh on me. Spirit of the Living God, fall fresh on me. Melt me; mold me; fill me; use me. Spirit of the Living God, fall fresh on me." (Daniel Iverson) The repetition lends this song a very "mantra"-like character. This is altogether fitting for the character of the Christian journey. Again and again, God calls on Christ's followers to begin anew, to make a fresh start.

We speak on occasion of circumstances "taking a turn for the better" or "taking a turn for the worse." We made an all-time high number of references to this in 2020, didn't we?! This is a figurative use of the word "turn." Also, notice that in expressions such as these, the word "turn" is a noun.

There are prevalent biblical uses of words meaning "turn." The Old Testament Hebrew word "shub" is a verb, which means "to turn." The New Testament Greek word "metanoia" frequently is translated "repentance." The Greek verb of the same root word is "metanoeo," which means "to turn around" or "to do an about-face." Literally, "metanoia" means "a change of mind" or "a turnaround."

The 2021 Season of Lent will begin this month. The season which extends from Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday is an intentional time for acknowledging our sin and asking God for forgiveness. But let's keep this in mind. An insincere plea to God for forgiveness—that is, a stark request which does not display any action or change on our part-will not result in us receiving God's grace. That would be what world-renowned, 20th century theologian Rev. Dr. Dietrich Bonhoeffer termed a play for "cheap grace." In other words, that would be an attempt to receive God's gift without offering God any sincere gesture of repentance ourselves. A cheap attempt on our part won't cut it when it comes to receiving the "costly grace of Christ." Our appeal for God's grace must be connected to a genuine act of repentance, that is, an evident "change" or "turning" on our part.

There are two faithful images of biblical "turning." The first is "turning away from" evil. The second is "turning towards" God. Both of these are significant, genuine acts of "turning" on the part of human beings which are legitimate displays of commitment to live differently from now on.

Scripture also sometimes uses the word "return." The idea is for a person to "make a 180-degree turn"—in other words, "to turn around." This is different from turning in a complete circle. Let's say we are facing some sort of evil. Then "returning," in a biblical sense, effectively is "to turn our backs on evil, and to face God." This is turning toward God, facing and heading in the direction of good. This is following Christ. This is genuine, costly, Christian repentance. Giving up our former orientation, our former direction, our "old ways"; frees people to follow the One who declares, "I am the Way." (John 14:6)

Long ago, Everlasting God announced to Israel, "Return to the Lord your God, and you and your children obey God with all your heart and with all your soul, just as I am commanding you today.... For God will again take delight in prospering you, just as God delighted in prospering your ancestors, when you obey the Lord your God by observing God's commandments and decrees that were written in this book of the law, because you turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul." (Deuteronomy 30:2, 9-10)

"Therefore, thus says the LORD: If you *turn* back, I will take you back, and you will stand before me...for I am with you to save you and deliver you, says the LORD. I will deliver you out of the hand of the wicked, and redeem you from the grasp of the ruthless." (Jeremiah 15:19-21) This is the spirit of wording on the banner which customarily hangs in lvy Chapel UCC's entryway throughout the Lenten Season. The banner reads: "*Return to the Lord with all your heart*." These words are a portion of Joel 2:12. This is an eternally stirring Scripture verse! It is synonymous with "repent"; "turn your life around"; "turn back to face God and to follow Christ."

Together, as we continue growing in Christian faith, may Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ come to treasure dearly the opening words of the sacred hymn **Great Is Thy Faithfulness**: "Great is Thy faithfulness, O God my Father. There is no shadow of **turning** with Thee. Thou changest not; Thy compassions they fail not. As Thou hast been, Thou forever wilt be." The meaning is that God never turns away from goodness or from compassion or from humankind.

Through the Prophet Jeremiah, God proclaims, "Go and say to the people of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, Can you not learn a lesson and obey my words?.... I have sent to you all my servants the


TRANSFIGURATION
