Five and a half years ago, our Missouri Mid-South Conference of the United Church of Christ attempted to get a new program off the ground which was designed to stir creative juices in local churches. It was named "New Beginnings." There was an initial 'Come and See' New Beginnings Event at another UCC in our area. One of our Ivy Chapel UCC members participated. Following the 'Come and See' Event, it was our decision, primarily based on collective wisdom of our Council leadership at that time, not to pursue involvement in it. 20/20 hindsight, that program actually may have been something quite groundbreaking and healthy for Ivy Chapel UCC to become involved in at the time. The reality is that we did not.

I believe it is fair to say that, then and now, our congregation's leaders are receptive to an approach of seeking "New Beginnings." If ever there were a moment ripe for a fresh start on our part, it is now. Together, may we be prayerful and open to what God is seeking to create anew through Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ now.

There is a portion of a traditional liturgy of confession which includes an "Assurance of Pardon" in these words: "The past is dead and gone. The future is open. Thanks be to God, we are forgiven! Amen."

What is on the horizon? This is a question that may be posed today at all levels of life. Uncertainty often

troubles us. However, if past months have revealed anything at all, this time of relative isolation during the COVID Pandemic has revealed that very little is certain. This extended period of time is continuing to reveal that human life is characterized by much uncertainty. It is my belief that this reality is not bad. We do not need to fear uncertainty. It is my belief that our faith teaches people to acknowledge and to embrace the impermanence of earthly life. Connected with this truth is a future with God—a future of unlimited potential! What is on the horizon? We do not fully know. We cannot. Yet, precisely in our not knowing, we realize that God's future is ripe with possibility and that God's future is wide open.

What is on the horizon for Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ? None of us fully knows. As *Ever-Alive, Ever -Creative God* leads, may you and I *joyfully* embrace the newness and the openness of whatever future God is envisioning for this faith community which is our dearly loved church home. This requires immense trust on our part. When we place our faith fully in Christ, God enables us to live with trust. I submit to you, my beloved companions, that one thing is sure: God's future will offer abundant opportunities for *"Creativity and Joy!"* These wholesome traits are characteristics of God.
