Why am I a Christian?

There are manifold answers to this question. No single answer is "the" correct answer.

We may explore this initial question by posing some additional questions, such as: Why am I a part of the Christian Church? Why am I a member of Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ? Why do I seek to follow Jesus of Nazareth?

Each of us has our own personal answer to such questions. Notice I have said "answer" in the singular. This is because I suspect that, for each individual human being, the way that we respond to one of these questions tends to be the same answer that we give to *all* of these questions.

In no way do I mean to imply that all people share the *same* answer. No, not at all. [This is very "United Church of Christ" when we think about it! Our denomination has no doctrine—that is, no "set, right teaching or position" on any matter. As the UCC, we affirm each person's personal views and beliefs. There may be no greater challenge than aspiring to live together in this manner—displaying mutual respect for one another. This can be extremely difficult, especially when someone else's belief blatantly conflicts with my belief. Certain other churches resolve this

quandary by establishing one clear church doctrine to which all church members are required to subscribe. Instead, the UCC chooses to "live with" differences by acknowledging and respecting differing beliefs. A bold approach! This requires depth of faith.] Okay, my friends, that's all for now concerning my biased editorial singing the praises of our United Church of Christ.

Back to the original topic of answering the above questions. I am suggesting that the way a given individual answers one of these four questions may be exactly how that same person answers *every one* of the questions.

Let's be clear. There is no "universal answer." Our individual answers will be as varied as we human beings are! Every one of us is unique. Therefore, from one person to the next, our answers are going to vary.

Each single one of us has our own individualized reasoning which informs our personal answer to questions like:

Why am I a Christian?

Why am I a part of the Christian Church?

Why am I a member of Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ?

Why do I seek to follow Jesus of Nazareth?

Allow me to offer several for instances. Some people claim that this is what they do because this is how they were "raised;" this is what they were taught. Maybe. Except this sounds a lot like doing something mainly to please your parents or your teachers. And isn't dedicating yourself to living as a Christ-follower and being an active participant in a faith community highly personal? In other words, doing these things with sincerity goes beyond merely taking action "to please other people." Declaring that you are living in this manner because this is what you were "trained" to do seems to lack significant personal investment in being a disciple.

Another for instance could be claiming that following Jesus "brings me joy." While there <u>is</u> joy to be experienced in living as a Christian, the truth is, "joy" is actually a starting place instead of a derivative result of Christian discipleship. Our Savior teaches us this, "God is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As God has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love...I have said these things to you, so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be full." (John 15:8-9, 11) Discipleship does not "result in" joy so much as discipleship "issues from" God-given joy. Joy begins with God.

Another for instance could be some people have a mentality that being a Christian is the equivalent of "being good." It is a skewed viewpoint that sees living as a Christian disciple as a means of gaining personal benefit. The motivation of anyone who looks at it this way would be for God to recognize them as "good" and reward them. Even the Son of God balks at this label, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone." (Mark 10:18 and Luke 18:19) Being a Christian is not about qualifying for or deserving a reward.

Beloved, may we examine ourselves and reflect on our character. As we do, one hopes that we will recognize following Christ is a response to the blessing and forgiveness and love which God first offers to us. You and I are not blessed or forgiven or loved because of our worthiness. You and I do not receive from God because we deserve gifts. You and I are given gifts by God purely because *God is good*. This is who God is. Solely out of God's goodness and God's desire to love are we loved.

We have peace with God through our Savior Jesus Christ who provides this grace in which we live. Grace is God's *free gift*. As the Apostle Paul wrote, "But the *free gift* is not like the trespass... the *free gift* in the grace of the One, Jesus Christ, abounded (Free Gift continued on page 5)

for the many... Therefore, just as one's trespass led to condemnation for all, so One's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. For just as by one's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by One's obedience the many will be made righteous. But law came in, with the result that the trespass multiplied; but where sin abounded, *grace over-abounded!*" (Romans 5:15, 18-20)

The Apostle Paul preached, "God raised him from the dead... Let this be known to you therefore, my beloved siblings, that through this One forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you. By this Jesus, everyone who believes is set *free* from all from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses." (Acts 13:30, 38-39)
