And It Was Good: Reflections on Beginnings, Madeleine L'Engle shares: "God's image! How much of God may be seen in me, may I see in others?... I believe that the Kingdom is built on the little things that all of us do. I remember my grandmother was fond of reciting:

> Little drops of water, Little grains of sand Make the mighty ocean And the pleasant land.

A single drop can't make even a puddle, but together, all our little drops and God's planning can make not only a mighty ocean but a mighty difference. And there's not much we can do, but when Peter healed a cripple, it was made very clear that it was not by his own power, but by the power of Christ, the creating Word, that the healing was accomplished. This power is available to all of us... Creation continues lavishly, and we are part of it. Not only are stars and people and fireflies born, not only do they die, but what we as creatures do during our lifespan makes a difference... When I look at the galaxies on a clear night—when I look at the incredible brilliance of creation, and think that this is what God is like, then, instead of feeling intimidated and diminished by it, I am enlarged—I rejoice that I am part of it, I, you, all of us—part of this glory... And our total inter-dependence is an astounding glory!"

The grandiose glory of God can seem 'beyond' us. However, Madeleine L'Engle importantly helps us to realize that you and I are part of God's glory. This is so vital for all people to be aware of. We are part of divine glory larger than ourselves. Each one of us is a valuable part of God's glorious creation; and creation "in toto" is grander, bigger than all of us put together! Far too frequently, we fail to absorb that God is the Creator of the whole universe! Thankfully, we are brought back to our senses and we are assisted in recognizing God as the One True Creator through the living witness of Holy Scripture. Simply read Isaiah 45 and Isaiah 46.

Carlo Carretto (1910-1988) was an Italian teacher and a member of the religious order the Little Brothers of Jesus. Carretto divided his personal time between the order's house in Oran (located in the Sahara Desert in northwestern Algeria) and the order's house in Spello (located in the Umbrian Hills in central Italy). Carretto was an author of numerous books. One of Brother Carretto's repeated,

literary themes was his description of God as "the God of the Impossible." (Summoned By Love, Orbis Books, Maryknoll, NY, 1978, pp. 127-130; and Journey Without End, Ave Maria Press, Notre Dame, IN, 1989, pp. 87-93). "God is the God of the Impossible: this is the foundation -stone of faith, the grounds for our courage, our hope against hope... The God of the Impossible is a God who knows, a God who can, a God who provides. God is the living One... Faith in the God of the Impossible has transformed my life and driven out fear, even fear of sinning. God is the living One. God overcomes... God raised Jesus from the dead. God builds God's Church out of weak stones such as we are. God gives food to the hungry. God fills the heart with joy regardless of worldly ordeals... God can forgive us. God loves us in spite of our sins. God sees all. God can do all. God is the God of the Impossible," marvels Brother Carretto.

The COVID-19 Pandemic lingers. Uh-huh, the world has gone 'viral.' Clearly, we are fatigued by it and fed up with it. Yet this prolonged experience is revealing that there are many things which we cannot control. For now, we continue coping with life in this *liminal season*. Could it be that one virtue derivative of the pandemic is that it is causing us to deepen our relationship with God?

Carlo Carretto was blessed with total faith and confidence in the Living One. Pray that we all may be led to embrace such a belief, such an absolute trust in the power and capability of God to do and to build and to give and to transform!

There's a lovely song that I recall singing after dark at church camp. While gathered close together in a campfire circle, everyone sang:

"Let the beauty of Jesus be seen in me, All his wonderful passion and purity; O Thou Spirit divine, All my nature refine, Till the beauty of Jesus be seen in me."

This is every disciple's ultimate pursuit—reflecting the beauty of Jesus. Each new day, may we continue "learning more of Christ" (Matthew 11:29) and so deepen our commitment to serving God.

Within this fragmented, uncomfortable 2022 context where we find ourselves living, are there wholesome, adventurous ways in which you and I can be growing as followers of Christ? What new aspects or actions might we begin incorporating into our daily faith walk?

FEBRUARY...

The Roman month *Februarius* was named after the Latin term *februum*, which means "purification", via the purification ritual *Februa* held on February 15 (full moon) in the old lunar Roman calendar.

Historical names for **FEBRUARY** include the Old English terms

Solmonath (mud month) and Kale-monath (named for cabbage) as well as Charlemagne's designation Hornung.

In FINNISH, the month is called *helmikuu*, meaning "month of the pearl"; when snow melts on tree branches, it forms droplets, and as these freeze again, they are like pearls of ice.



In POLISH and UKRAINIAN, respectively, the month is called *luty* or лютий (*lyutiy*), meaning the month of ice or hard frost.

In MACEDONIAN the month is *sechko* (сечко), meaning month of cutting (wood).

In CZECH, it is called *únor*, meaning month of submerging (of river ice).

Having only 28 days in common years, February is the only month of the year that can pass without a single full moon.

Trustees

The Trustees kept busy in 2021 with the completion of several major projects:

- The third roofing attempt over Fellowship Hall was completed and successful.
- A major sewer leak in the playground was repaired.
- An inspection by the Chesterfield Fire Marshal resulted in a Safety Report with a list of 12 items that were successfully addressed.
- A new telephone system branded by AT&T was installed in the Church. The new system connects wirelessly with four other extensions and has answering and call transferring functions.
- Memorial Garden has received a makeover. The bench and fountain were reconstructed and painted with two coats of waterproof paint.

As always, regular mowing, trimming, raking, and general maintenance of the grounds continued throughout the pandemic. New trees are being planted that will mitigate erosion as well as beautify the area.

We worked with Juniper Root Woodland Microschool to remove old playground equipment, repair the playground fence, and cut back brush, including honeysuckle, weeds, and invasive vines, along the lower lot and pathway to the pavilion.

PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too."

There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age,

having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eightyfour. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to



speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.
