

Presence

The Lenten Season is a 40-day time period for Christian, spiritual growth. The season is intended to serve as an opportunity for all who are God's Church to grow in our devotion to Christ in preparation for the celebration of Resurrection Day. Christians engage in a wide array of faith practices during these 40 sacred days. These practices are sometimes called spiritual "disciplines." People do many things during Lent, including giving up (certain foods, bad habits, etc.) and increasing virtuous activities (taking on a commitment, offering, praying, etc.). This year, as the month of March begins, the Season of Lent begins. The date of the first day of the holy season this year is Ash Wednesday, March 2.

"Discipline is the other side of discipleship," writes Jesuit Priest Henri Nouwen. "Discipleship without discipline is like waiting to run in the marathon without ever practicing... Discipline in the spiritual life is the concentrated effort to create the space and time where God can become our master and where we can respond freely to God's guidance... to set apart a time and a place where God's gracious *presence* can be acknowledged and responded to." (<u>Bread for the Journey</u>, Henri Nouwen, 1997)

Cleansing is a central metaphor during the Christian Season of Lent. The perennial psalm for Ash Wednesday is Psalm 51. This familiar psalm overflows with cleansing imagery. "Have mercy... blot out my transgressions... wash me... cleanse me... purge me with hyssop, then I shall be clean... wash me... create in me a clean heart, O God."

God's cleansing *presence* is mysterious. In The Elusive Presence (1978), author Samuel Terrien delves into the elusive character of God in "Chapter 7 - The Play of Wisdom" (pp. 350-380), which draws upon biblical writings of Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Job. Terrien expounds on God's "Presence Beyond Grasp" (pp. 362-365); God's "Presence Beyond Time" (pp. 365-368); and God's "Presence Beyond Honor" (pp. 368-373). Truly, the presence of God is elusive. Yet humankind often encounters God unintentionally. This is the beauty of human relationships with the Divine. Our relationships with God are beyond us! We are not able to "summon" the presence of God at will. More often than not, we profoundly sense the presence of God under circumstances in which we inadvertently have stumbled into God's living presence! This is humbling and astounding! Author Samuel Terrien describes this phenomenon in these words, "In spite of darkness, presence induced illumination." (The Elusive Presence, p. 373)

When we experience the eternal *presence* of God, we are overwhelmed and blessed. In his insightful work With Burning Hearts (1994), Henri Nouwen reflects on the walk along the road to Emmaus on the evening of Resurrection Day (Luke 24:13-35). "When Jesus joins us on the road and explains the scriptures to us, we must listen with our whole being, trusting that the word that created us will also heal us. God wants to become present to us and thus radically transform our fearful hearts. The sacramental quality of the word makes God present not only as an intimate presence, but also as a presence that gives us a place in the great story of salvation... The word lifts us up and makes us see that our daily, ordinary lives are, in fact, sacred lives that play a necessary role in the fulfillment of God's promises... Without the word, our life has little meaning, little vitality, and little energy... We need the word spoken and explained by the one who joins us on the road and makes his presence known to us-a presence first discerned in our burning hearts. It is this presence that encourages us to let go of our hardened hearts and become grateful. A grateful people we can invite into the intimacy of our home the one who has made our hearts burn." (With Burning Hearts, Chapter 2, "Discerning the Presence", pp. 48-50)

This Lent, try a basic approach. Simplify. Seek the Presence of Christ. Nothing more.

At the center of his stirring book <u>In the Presence of the</u> <u>Wise and Gentle Christ</u> (1993), James McNamara devotes a chapter to Simon Peter's personal journey from fear to faith. McNamara concludes this chapter with the following prayer:

My Jesus,

I follow you knowing you are my Lord, Learning that observing Laws is not enough. When the headwinds of my doubts overwhelm me, I call to you.

You reach out and rescue me.

Draw me close that I may listen and discover who you are.

Gift me with insight into how you work through the activities of my every day.

Soften my stubborn ways that I might be free to grow.

Temper my impulsiveness that I may take time to reflect.

Release me from the hold I have on pride and lead me gently into humility. Enter my fearful heart, struggling with denial and re-form it with your love. May the strength of your forgiveness Conquer the weakness of my failures. May the promise of your presence Ground me in trust. With the help of your Holy Spirit may I choose peace over power, hope over despair, faith over fear, You—over all others. Amen.

Why, this prayer is a wondrous prayer that each of us could pray!

May your personal, Lenten walk "in the *presence* of the Wise and Gentle Christ" offer you newness of life. Little by little, open your soul to the cleansing *presence* of God.

Breathe on us, Breath of God. Fill us with life anew, Pastor Dan



Receiving ashes is what connects us to people throughout Scripture. Ashes were-are-regarded as a symbol of mourning and repentance and our own mortality.
