et's say that there is a conversation between two peopl One person presents the other with a seemingly unfeasible task to accomplish. The second person responds, "Why, I'll never be able to do such a thing. That's **nigh** on to impossible!" What this response means is that the feat is "nearly impossible."

The word "*nigh*" is not a word which comes up much in contemporary conversation. Yes, it is a rather dated word. However, it is not insignificant, because the word "*nigh*" suitably describes God's present availability. God is close by. This is ever true.

Memorable lyrics to the hymn <u>I Need Thee Every</u> <u>Hour</u> by Annie Hawks include: *"I need Thee every hour, Stay Thou near-by; Temptations lose their pow'r When Thou art* **nigh**. *I need Thee, O I need Thee; Every hour I need Thee; O bless me now, my Savior, I come to Thee."*

Is there ever a moment, an instant, when God is not *nigh*? No. According to our faith in the abiding presence of the Holy One; at all times, God is *nigh*.

In light and in darkness, God is near. At life's high points and at life's low points, God is near. On Christ's Cross and at Christ's Empty Tomb, God is near. The bugle call "Taps" has an intriguing, if somewhat sketchy, history dating back to the U. S. Civil War Era (and still farther back!). The tune with which we are familiar was composed in 1862 by then-Brigade Commander Daniel Butterfield of the Union Army. "Butterfield's Lullaby" is an adaptation of its predecessor, a Union Army bugle call named "Tattoo," that served as notice to the troops that the hour had come to extinguish all lights and call it a day. The bugle call concluding the day was immediately followed by three "taps" on a drum. From those three drumbeats was derived the familiar name of this bugle call-"Taps." While there are no 'official words' to the tune, among the popular verses are these lyrics:

> Day is done, Gone the sun, From the lake, From the hill, From the sky. All is well. Safely rest. God is **nigh**.

One of the calming, reassuring ways that our Savior Jesus helps people to settle down in the manner of (Continued on page 2.) those who are attempting to settle in for the night is by conveying, "God is withyou. God Emmanuel. I am. God is **nigh**." To the paralytic, Jesus says, "Take heart!" To the woman with a flow of blood, Jesus says, "Take heart!" To the blind man, Jesus' disciples say, "Take heart! Arise! Jesus is calling you!" To his terrified disciples floundering in high winds and waves on the sea, Jesus says, "Take heart! I am. Fear not."

As this Lenten Season proceeds, may all the people of God's world find comfort in the abiding nearness of God. "Abide with me: fast falls the eventide; The darkness deepens; Lord, with me abide. When other helpers fail, and comforts flee, Help of the helpless, O abide with me. Swift to its close ebbs out life's little day; Earth's joys grow dim, its glories pass away; Change and decay in all around I see. O Thou who changest not, abide with me." (Abide with Me by Henry Lyte) In coming days, faithful companions, may you be comforted, as our Savior Jesus encourages, "Take heart.

Fear not."

Trustees


