Can you and I try new things?

Psalm 103 is a song of *newness!* Inspiring lyrics based on Psalm 103 are: *"Think about God's love; think about God's goodness; think about God's grace that's brought us through. For as high as the heavens above, so great is the measure of our God's love. Great is the measure of our God's love."*

Singing *"a new song"* is a risky venture. Sometimes a *new song* goes over well. Sometimes it does not. We never know unless we try, do we?

It is a healthy act of faith to sing "new songs" from time to time. Of course, many love to tell the old, old story. And it is important to sing songs which we already know by heart as a way of expressing our faith. During worship recently, our congregation shared in a unison reading of Psalm 23. Many of us enjoyed this. Some folks here in worship that morning recited the psalm from memory! Yet Living God advises us not to limit ourselves only to what we are already familiar with. This is true, not only in music, but in all areas of life. We must take care not to become overly attached to what we already know. God also summons us to sing "new songs." Consider this. The only way to learn a song by heart is to sing it in the first place. Even those songs which we now

have memorized were once *brand new* to us. Everything that now is familiar to us was once unfamiliar to us. Mind-blowing! We learn and develop *new* favorites by trying out *"new songs."* An array of biblical psalms speak of this. (Psalms 33, 40, 96, 98,144, and more)

Did you know?

PENTECOST has different meanings depending on who uses it.

Pentecost is a "Hellenistic term". In Greek, it means "fifty". The day of Pentecost coincides to the Festival of Weeks (or Feast of Weeks). In Hebrew the Feast of Weeks it is known as **SHAVUOT**. It was one of the holy festivals of the Israelites instituted by God. This festival marked the wheat harvest in the Land of Israel. It's first mention is in Exodus 34:22, "You shall observe the festival of weeks, the first fruits of wheat harvest, and the festival of ingathering at the turn of the year." We learn more about the "wave

offering" in Leviticus 23:9-11(NASB) and how this festival came about and was conducted (called THE COUNTING OF OMER) in Leviticus 23:15-22.

So is it coincidental (not when it comes to God) that the Holy Spirit comes to the Disciples in the day of Pentecost—also a time known as Shavuot? Or is it part of God's plan for His children?

It was decided to ask the Council if they were interested in organizing a Fellowship Event to attend a Sunday evening Jazz Band Concert in July or August.


After the meeting we went to the Butterfly House in Faust Park and enjoyed the beautiful active butterflies as well as seeing some emerge from their pupas.
