God's Church is now smack dab in the middle of a peak season in our faith. The stretch of time between Resurrection Day and Pentecost Day is the Christian Church's Season of Easter. This time is known as "The Great Fifty Days." So here we are, dear friends. We are "milking" Christ's Resurrection for all it's worth. Why not? Is there anything greater?!

No one—inside of or outside of God's Church—can top Resurrection Day—the Day of days—Easter Sunday! Faithful Christian theology recognizes that every worship service is "a little Easter." Truly, every service of worship is an occasion for a resurrection celebration! What a vision! Each and every time that anyone worships God, we are expressing an Easter Alleluia!

Marcus Halley, Rector of St. Paul's Church on Lake of the Isles in Minneapolis, Minnesota, proclaims, "Human beings are endlessly complicated, frail and stubborn. Not only do we bear the image of God, we also bear the likeness of one another—the good, the bad, and the ugly. Proof of our frailty is found in our ability to rehearse and rehash our mistakes over and over again... What is true—and more powerful than our never-ending opposition to the Holy Spirit—is God's grace toward us. We stand in need of redemption. Thank goodness God

possesses an endless supply of mercy and grace, and is always ready to give us far more than we deserve, ask for, or could imagine."

"I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Now to the One who by the power at work within us is able to do far more than all we can ask or imagine, to God be the glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever.

Rector Halley muses, "I wonder if we make enough space in our lives to experience holiness. Our lives are much easier if we hold God and other things that require vulnerability at arm's length... But the work of God breaches our surest defenses with a relentless, take-no-prisoners love. In the very places that we feel most secure, God will surprise us by walking through and extending an invitation to new life. Surprise is God's way of disarming us, helping us to be vulnerable enough to consider a different way forward."

"A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was the greatest." (Luke 22:24)

So, Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many." (Mark 10:42-45)

Friends in Christ, may you and I relish the remaining days of this sacred **Easter Season**. May each of us open ourselves to the marvelous surprises which God offers to everyone who is willing to become a vulnerable recipient of grace.

These are "The Great Fifty Days," for they comprise the time period when God's Church is caught up in an ongoing celebration rejoicing over Christ's astonishing Resurrection! If any event is surprising, it surely is **the Resurrection** of Jesus Christ. As Rev. Rachel Hackenberg ecstatically proclaims, "Easter's life is greater than Good Friday's death." Surprise is God's way!

Catch this wave; and be uplifted by the swell of God's ever-rising Eastertide! Be vulnerable enough to consider a different way forward... "God's way!" Then rise and live with joyful abandon!

The Resurrection is Christ Jesus rising from death to life. This is high tide—Eastertide! Rise and surprise! Christ is alive! Now is eternally a moment for all God's people to arise!

Mary Martha Wmns Grp


The Mary and Martha Women's Group met on Tuesday, April 19th. We decided to go to the Butterfly House in Faust Park at our next meeting on May 17th.

Did you know?

"Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called **EMMAUS**, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened." ~Luke 24:13-14

There are several towns that are thought to be—the New Testament town of Emmaus apparently no longer exists.

Quintilius Varus, was sent to Jerusalem to assist in subduing an insurrection that arose due to oppression over the Jews by Sabnus (who just happened to arrive shortly before Pentecost—Jewish festival of Shavuot). As a result, Sepphoris, the ancient capital of Galilee, was burned, and all its inhabitants were sold as slaves, after which Varus marched on **EMMAUS** in the west, and burned it likewise, the inhabitants saving themselves by flight.

Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." - Replace East post on "Preschool" sign




HIGHWAY CLEAN-UP
