Our United Church of Christ has a national church website which offers an impressive array of messages and ministries. One of the lively resources which anyone may access through our denomination's website is UCC Still-Speaking Daily Devotional! https://www.ucc.org/daily-devotional/

A group of UCC pastors contribute daily, spiritual reflections to this site. On a couple of different occasions during the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Still-Speaking Writers' Group has compiled booklets which have been provided to local church clergy. The first was distributed in 2020, and it was given the succinct title, "EMERGE." The second booklet, distributed in 2021, was entitled, "What if?" (This question will strike a chord with anyone who was part of Ivy Chapel UCC back in 2011. That year, our congregation embarked together on a 'visionary *journey'* with a "fill-in-the-blank" theme: "What if...?") The 2021 UCC Still-Speaking Writers' Group booklet is a modest 21 pages. Each page bears one "What if?" question for reflection. One of this booklet's insightful questions is:

What if you actually gave thanks for the very breath in your body?

"Breathe on me, Breath of God; fill me with life anew, That I may love the way you love, and do what you would do." (Edwin Hatch) Clearly, breathing is foundational to human life. In the concise, sacred wisdom of Adriene Mishler, "The body comes to stillness, but breathing continues."

The "Spirit of God" is portrayed, at times, as divine breath or holy wind. You will recall that the New Testament Greek word *"pneuma"* may be translated as several, different English words, including "breath," or "wind," or "spirit."

The traditional Gospel text for the Sunday one week after Easter Sunday every year is John 20:19-31. This Scripture recounts two of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances. It leads off on the evening of Resurrection Day. "Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced... Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As God has sent me, so I send you.' When Jesus had said this, he **breathed** on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'" (John 20:19-22) Receive the Holy Breath! This is a portion of God's Word which I find tremendously powerful. Christ's central actions in this exchange are showing the disciples his wounds and *breathing*. To convey to the disciples that he truly is alive, Jesus breathes on them. The disciples are able to feel Jesus

exhaling. They *feel* his **breath**. Think of this sensation! What more direct way to assure them that he is alive and **breathing** than for the Risen Christ to **breathe on** his followers? Genius!

Breathing is an act of life. Yet, much of the time, we breathe subconsciously. We breathe so automatically that we fail to value breathing as a gift and a blessing. But it is miraculous! The breath of life is a gift from God. This is a truth to value: Human beings are children of God. By the grace of God, human beings breathe!

Breath by breath, God is with us. Breath by breath, our lungs inhale oxygen. Molecules of O2 enter human lungs and contact the walls of the lungs at capillary exchange sites (alveoli) where oxygen enriches blood cells. Breath by breath, oxygen nourishes human blood into oxygen-rich blood cells! Then these nourished, red blood cells travel to the rest of the body to deliver energy and life! Fascinating and wonderful! *"You have searched me, O God, and you know me... Where can I* go to get away from your Spirit? Where can I go to escape your presence?... I praise you that I am fearfully and wonderfully made! Wonderful are your works! That I know very well!" (Psalm 139:2, 7, 14)

God's design is marvelous! Our calling as Christ's followers is to be growing, 'grace-breathing' children of Most High God. This faith-walk does not require all giant steps. Sure, every now and then, circumstances do call on us to make "leaps" of faith. However, by and large, Jesus Christ steadily is calling on each of us to follow one moment, one act, one step, one breath at a time. Seeking to serve as givers of Christ's pure love is this basic.

Everywhere that we look in the world today, there appears to be discord and turmoil. Much threatens to be spinning out of control. In this contemporary climate, we risk feeling overwhelmed. And yet, may we not despair. God's prophet encourages us not to be dismayed. (Isaiah 41:8-10 and Isaiah 43:1-3) The Planet Earth and humankind are dearly loved parts of God's creation. Each moment, God abundantly blesses creation with life! (John 10) May each soul continue discovering life's true center in Christ. We have been given ears to hear, eyes to see, and lips to tell. *"All things bright and beautiful, All creatures great and small, All things wise and wonderful, The Lord God made them all. God gave us eyes to see them, And lips that we might tell How great is God Almighty, Who has*
