

God's Mercies Never Come to an End

In every generation, God's people have learned that we can depend on God's *mercy*. Timeless appeals of the psalmists echo down to this very day:

"Have *mercy* on me, O God, according to your steadfast love, according to the abundance of your *tender mercies*, blot out the stain of my sins." Psalm 51:1

"Be *merciful* to me, O God, be *merciful* to me; for in you my soul takes refuge."

Psalm 57:1

There arrive moments when it seems as though the demands of this life may overwhelm us. Yet we always are able to call on God for help. When we ask, God's help is provided. God showed Abraham the place where God wanted him to go. Abraham went there. At the last instant, just as he was about to sacrifice his son Isaac, God called out, "Abraham! Abraham! Don't hurt the boy. Now I know that you revere God." Then Abraham named that place, "The LORD will provide." (Genesis 22) God's mercies never end.

For sure, there may be extended stretches of time when we must continue watching and waiting for help. At such times, if relief does not appear, our souls grow weary. Still, Christ calls on us to retain faith in God's promises, and so we wait. We have our doubts. A long wait may cause us to become discouraged, or even cynical. Yet God's mercies will appear. This is

as God's Word describes, "I am one who has seen affliction... The thought of my affliction and my homelessness is wormwood and gall. My soul continually thinks of it and is bowed down within me. But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of God never ceases, God's mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." (Lamentations 3) Ultimately, God's mercies are provided. God's gifts do not take place according to our wishes or on our timetables! We tend to have difficulty accepting this. But it is true. God's mercies arrive we know not when, we know not how. Keep watching. Keep believing. In the fullness of time. Merciful God will bless.

In his ministry, Jesus Christ teaches, "I say to you who are listening, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. If someone strikes you on one cheek, offer them the other cheek, too." (Luke 6:27-29)

Carlo Carretto (1910-1988) was an Italian religious in the order of the Little Brothers of Jesus. Carretto was a contemplative Christian, a 20th century "Desert Father." In 1983, Brother Carretto wrote a small book entitled, *Ho cercato y ho trovato* (*I Sought and I Found*). In this personal confession, Carretto divulges twists and turns which he himself has discovered along the way on his spiritual walk, "Many

people who start reading the Bible without adequate preparation, end by closing the Book in surprise and even fright, at God's apparent harshness where sinners are concerned. The fact is that the Bible, too, is on a journey, the same journey as the people of God, bearing witness on its way to a progressive discovery of that God who will eventually reveal God-self in God's fullness and in all God's splendor in Christ... Christ is the transition from the Old to the New. Christ is the revelation of a God who had been distorted by our by our childish fears and our stunted sense of justice and love! In my spiritual infancy, the sinner enraged me and inspired me with the passion to eliminate, or at least to punish.

In the maturity of Jesus' revelation, the sinner inspires me with compassion, and calls out to me for **mercy**... I believe in non-violence... I believe in prophecy more than in politics. I believe in Gandhi. I believe in Martin Luther King. I believe in Archbishop Oscar Romero... Jesus teaches me how to enter the kingdom that is Jesus' kingdom. When the choice lies between a civil law prescribing the death penalty for someone who strikes me, and Jesus who tells me to turn the other cheek, I know which to conform to in my heart. Between a civil law that jails an adulteress, and Jesus' manner of treating the adulterous woman in the gospel, I know how to choose, even though it may scandalize a few of the devout... What I have tried to do in this book is sum up, for my friends, and for those who want to seek God, the route that I have travelled... What convinced me of the existence of God was contemplation. What convinced me of God's life and God's heart was **mercy**. I turned completely to God in prayer, and I discovered God's inmost essence is God's capacity to forgive.

The grandest thing I can say about God is that God is **merciful**, and I believe in universal salvation. God's capacity for love, God's thirst for justice, God's battle against evil, God's desire to embrace humankind like a prodigal joined to the power God has to make all things new! - all this can be summed up in these words, quoted by Jesus: 'Mercy I desire, not sacrifice' (Matthew 9:13; cf. Hosea 6:6)... This is why the gospel can be summed up in Luke's Parable of the Prodigal, the return to the father of the far-away child. The return is God's victory, God's true joy. By **mercy**, God slakes the prodigal's thirst for love. Knowing God, even though I know it is possible we may become lost, I am now convinced that all will be saved." (pp. 128-134)

Brother Carretto's arrival at this lovely belief in universal salvation reminds me of another sacred book published 20 years later by two Quaker pastors, Philip Gulley and James Mulholland, which is entitled, <u>If Grace Is True: Why God Will Save Every Person.</u>

Let's recall our Savior's words. As soon as Jesus had concluded teaching the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10), he asked his inquisitor, "Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" The reply came, "The one who showed him **mercy**." Finally, Jesus commanded, "Go, and do the same."

Over and over, Christ's life and teachings emphasize offering *mercy*. God's *tender mercies* never come to an end.

May your soul overflow with the *mercy* of God, *Pastor Dan*






Autumn Voyage "to Faith and Giving"
