The Advent of Christ

Plan a trip, and one needs to consider the timing of the trip. Anyone who has gone on a trip is aware that travel involves departure and arrival times. In God's Church, disciples have an itinerary. We call it the Christian Church Year. The first 'season' in this year is the Advent Season.

During the Season of Advent, the Church makes preparations for the "coming" celebration of the Birth of Christ. This year Christmas Day will fall on a Sunday. Big events require substantial time to get ready. The Christian Church is highly intentional about preparing to celebrate the Holy Birth of the Christ-Child. The four Sundays preceding December 25th are the Sundays of Advent. These days are our prep time. On each of these Sundays, Christians light one new candle on the Advent Wreath. Then, on Christmas Eve (or Christmas Day, or both), the Church lights the final candle. The tall, white candle at the center of the Advent Wreath is named the Christ Candle. This candle is white to represent the purity of Christ.

Traditionally, our congregation shares the light of the Christ Candle while singing Silent Night as the closing hymn during Christmas Eve Worship. We could think of this as somewhat of a 'take-off' on the song Pass It On. It only takes a spark. Soon all those around can warm up in its glowing. The imagery of sharing the Light of Christ is a powerful symbol of our faith. God intends for all people to offer one another pure light and love.

In first century Palestine, God's
Archangel Gabriel informed Mary that
- lo and behold! - she soon would be
expecting a new arrival. However,
Gabriel provided no specifics. It may be
God's messenger realized that this
already was overwhelming enough
blowing Mary away with the
preposterous revelation of her
approaching pregnancy! Consequently,
Gabriel did not supply Mary with a time
and location when this Messiah would be
making a first appearance.

After the Annunciation, Mary was aware that she was going to give birth to a child. Yet she was unaware of the birthplace; unaware that she would be bearing her baby all the way to the City of David before he was born! Given all that was still a mystery to her makes it remarkable that Mary responded to Gabriel, agreeing, "Behold, your handmaid, the servant of the Lord. Let it be with me according to your word." (Luke 1:38)

She knows not where. She knows not when. Even so, Mary trusts God has a role for her to serve in the birth of this holy, new arrival. Speaking words of wisdom; let it be. Oh, that our souls similarly may proclaim the greatness of God and exult in God our Savior! (Luke 1:47) The holiness of Christmas is its simplicity. Christ is born.

Marchaé Grair witnesses, "If you've ever been scared to do what's right but done it anyway, then you understand the cost of Advent. On the other side of the invitation, 'Come, Lord Jesus,' is a radical Savior who refuses to treat anyone as disposable and who requires us to expand our courage and leverage our privilege to strive for collective liberation. In this season of waiting, we prepare for the coming of Emmanuel, whose presence with us demands that we embody Divine courage in moments of injustice."

Long ago, disciples of John the Baptist came to John, saying, "Rabbi, the one who was with you across the Jordan,... here he is baptizing, and all are going to him." John answered, "... You yourselves are my witnesses that I said, 'I am not the Messiah, but I have been

sent ahead of him.'... For this reason my joy has been fulfilled. He must increase; I must decrease." (John 3:25-30)

In the coming days, the Church's Advent Wreath will become a growing ring of fire. Sunday by Sunday, candle by candle; the light will increase. As Christians throughout God's world get ready for a 2022 celebration of our Savior's birth, may our souls be enlivened by God's bright starlight! May we mimic Mother Mary - pondering how we may serve Mighty God; trusting that soon God is about to do something "new" (Isaiah 43:19; Revelation 21:5); something "marvelous" (Psalm 118:23; First Peter 2:9); something "for all the world" (Luke 2:14; John 3:16-17).

Wonder. Watch. Wait... Christ is coming,


