You Are Cleansed

The 2023 Lenten Season is underway. As the saying goes, "The sky's the limit!" One of the virtues of committing to and sticking with a 40-day journey toward Resurrection Day is that such a venture offers unlimited potential. Ideally, our relationship with God in Christ Jesus grows and continues growing!

"Cleansing" is a central metaphor of Christianity. Plain and simple. You are cleansed. Repent.

The simple basis for the Lenten Season is repentance. Yet we must be careful not to get it backwards. The order is not (1) repent, and (2) we will be forgiven. If there is an "order" at all, it is (1) we are forgiven, we are cleansed already; therefore, (2) we repent.

We repent, <u>not</u> "in order to be forgiven;" we repent "out of" gratitude that God already has offered us forgiveness. Crucial to the whole picture is God's grace. This connects closely with Christ's petition from the Cross: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34) The Rev. Dr. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a World-War-Two-era Lutheran pastor in

Germany, identified this in his 1933 lectures at the University of Berlin. Years later, these lectures were re-created from his students' notes and eventually published under the English title Christ the Center. The sure foundation of 'discipleship - costly and joyful' is Christ. As our Savior declares, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." (Matthew 16:24; Mark 8:34; Luke 9:23) Christ cleanses. That's all there is to it. Cleansing.

The psalm traditionally read on Ash Wednesday is Psalm 51. This familiar psalm abounds with "cleansing" imagery. "Have mercy... blot out my transgressions... wash me... cleanse me... Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean. Wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow... Create in me a clean heart, O God." All of this and more is in Psalm 51.

Have you ever participated in some type of guided meditation or spiritual exercise which involved the leader inviting participants to inhale deeply and then to exhale fully? This action is called "a cleansing breath." Typically, a meditation leader may invite everyone in a group to

join in by giving them a simple prompt, such as, "Cleansing breath. Breathe in. Hold it. Breathe out."

The Rev. Elisha Hoffman (1839-1929) was an ordained minister and a composer of sacred music. He is best known for the widely-sung, classic hymn Leaning on the Everlasting Arms (1894). Rev. Hoffman also composed Have You Been to Jesus for the Cleansing Power? This hymn's Spirit-filled lyrics include: "Have you been to Jesus for the cleansing power? Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb? Are you fully trusting in His grace this hour? Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb? Are you walking daily by the Savior's side? Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb? Do you rest each moment in the Crucified? Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb? ... Lay aside the garments that are stained with sin, and be washed in the blood of the Lamb: There's a fountain flowing for the soul unclean, O be washed in the blood of the Lamb!... Are you washed in the blood, in the soul-cleansing blood of the Lamb? Are your garments spotless? Are they white as snow? Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb?"

You are cleansed. Repent. God invites us to approach Lent in this spirit. Granted, there are aspects of the forty days of Lent which may not be pleasant. Honest self-examination is necessary, and this can be painfully difficult. Taking a genuine look at ourselves may reveal disappointing truths. Yet we cannot merely brush off reality. This would be taking the sacred season too lightly. Being true to the full character of Lent calls us to risk engaging in some unpleasantness. There is an element of struggle involved in every spiritual pilgrimage. But don't despair. Personal faith struggles often result in growth. God's

Prophet declares, "Come now, let us argue it out, says the LORD; though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be like snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool." (Isaiah 1:18) In the end, each Lenten Journey arrives at Resurrection Joy. Ultimately, every Lenten Season leads to some version of this astonishing discovery: God loves me, flaws and all. Alleluia!

I encourage you to allow something on the order of the following serve as your basic approach during this Lenten Season. *Receive God's cleansing*. The rest is excess. Simplify. "Uncomplicate." Streamline. God wants to cleanse you. Actually, God already has! This is the simple, uncomplicated truth. It is purely a gift. So just accept God's cleansing. Christ the Center.

In the days ahead, may you make your way toward Resurrection Joy by seeking to make "Christ the Center" of your life. Lent is merely an occasion for us to get started. It will take far longer than forty days. We'll need to work at this for the rest of our earthly days... breath by cleansing breath.

Christ the Center. Breathe in. Hold the breath. Breathe out. Christ the Center.


