

God Continues

The enduring presence of God provides abundant blessing. One verb which can be faithfully associated with God is the action verb "to continue." Yes, God's involvement with creation, with growth, with newness, with living creatures, with humankind, and with all life continues. God continues! Exceptional qualities of God include: God continues forgiving. God continues loving. God continues raising to new life! God continues giving.

God continues! The on-going relationship of God giving gifts to creation spans generations. God's giving is spoken of throughout the first book of the Bible (Genesis 1, Genesis 9, Genesis 12-13, Genesis 15-17. Genesis 21-24, Genesis 26-28, Genesis 30, Genesis 35, Genesis 41, and Genesis 48).

Jesus of Nazareth is a rabbi; that is, a teacher. One of the central truths which Jesus teaches is, "God is giving." As we behold the faithful presence and character of God, we consistently perceive that God is a Giving God.

On one occasion in Jerusalem, just as the 'religious establishment' was trying very hard to trip Jesus up and to find fault with what he said, they sent a devious group of Herodians and Pharisees to ask,

"Teacher,... is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?"

Jesus replied, "Bring me a denarius." They brought him one.

Jesus asked, "Whose head is on this coin?"

They replied, "The emperor's."

Then Jesus continued, "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and give to God what belongs to God." His reply left them overcome with wonder. (Mark 12:13-17)

Jesus, the Anointed One of God, reveals who God is. Additionally, the Anointed One reveals who God desires us to be; that is, reveals the manner in which God desires that we live. Jesus consistently teaches that God envisions human lives being lives of giving. Jesus teaches through word and through action.

Behold, the manifold *giving* which Jesus embodies! Jesus brings to life 'the Way' of God. In word and deed, our Savior proclaims, "I am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life... Truly, truly, I say to you, one who believes in me will also do the works that I do... this is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees the Spirit nor knows the Spirit. You know the Spirit, because the Spirit remains with you, and the Spirit will be in you."

(John 14:6, 12, 16-17)

God continues... Years ago, Ivy Chapel UCC Chancel Choir offered the Gospel message one Sunday in Advent as a Christmas Cantata by Sandi Patty, entitled, The Gift Goes On. Some lyrics of the title song are:

"Now when your life is full of Christmas Then your life is full of love.
You can give away the present
That began with God above.
Just like ripples in the water
The circles of our love extend.
What was started with God above
Is a Gift that has no end.

And the Gift goes on!
The Father gave the Son,
And the Gift goes on!
The Son gave the Spirit,
And the Gift goes on!
The Spirit gives us life,
And the Gift goes on and on and on!
So we can give the Gift of love..."

I treasure the *continuity* expressed by this message. Our God is a *Giving God!* And the Gift goes on! Everlasting, Eternal, Forevermore *God continues*.

What then, my friends, are we to do with the teachings of Christ in our day? At this time of such pronounced division and conflict? You and I are called by God to apply the teachings of Christ in our day-to -day living.

Living lives of *giving* in the manner of Christ encompasses both supporting 'God's Justice' and opposing every *injustice*. God's Prophet and our contemporary, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., preached, "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere."

Sadly, at this moment, across our nation, there is evil condemnation and hatred rampantly manifesting itself in government and in society at large. It is time for you and me, with our Risen Savior Jesus strengthening us, to serve God as bold, Christ-like witnesses in opposition to every *injustice*; such as, condemnation, hatred, racism, persecuting the LGBTQIA community, legislative over-reach criminalizing personal matters, seeking to control other people, bullying, shaming, judging.

We must not be misled by any "holier-than-thou" individual (regardless of their notoriety, their title, or their station in life) who tries to claim that they are oppressing others because they themselves are "Christian." This is profaning the very name of Christ. Condemning and judging are *not* "Christ-like" living.

"For God so loved the world that God gave God's only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God sent God's Son into the world **not to condemn** the world, but to save the world through him." (John 3:16-17)

Our Gracious Savior Jesus Christ teaches, "Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. For you will be treated as you treat others. The standard you use in judging is the standard by which you will be judged." (Matthew 7:1-2 NLT)

Podcaster and author Alicia Chole reflects,

"Hope. We need it to thrive. How we source it is critical to its sustainability... The question is key: How do we live hope-filled about the future and realistic about today?... In short, the church, in our sincere desire to help those struggling with disappointment, often sends a message that the source of hope today is what might be 'right around the corner' tomorrow... we say, 'Hold on. God has something better just around the corner. Tolerate today because God will deliver something better tomorrow.' (And then we make a video of the few for whom this is true.) And what of the rest?... Did God fail them? Did they fail God? Or perhaps we have all sourced hope in the possible realization of dreams tomorrow instead of the certain presence of God today. Personally, how do I stay healthy when my dreams are delayed? By working to ensure that my soul's address for hope is in God and God's love for me. My hope is sourced in God's love today - not the materialization of my dreams tomorrow.

My hope is rooted in God's company not in my scenery. Do I abandon my dreams? No. But neither do I make their *future* fulfillment the 'why' of my hope. I do not have to 'hold on for what's right around the corner,' because Jesus is always holding me in this moment today. God loves methat's a worthy address for hope... as well as for contentment and peace. Such a sacrificial Savior is trustworthy enough to steward my (and your) dreams. Whatever our circumstances or scenery, today through Jesus we are known in heavenly realms as God's beloved. Sinking deeply into that reality sources a sustainable hope and gifts our faith with roots and our dreams with wings." (Hope's Source, 2016, Alicia Britt Chole)

God is present *now*. No need to wait. Live a life of *giving*. Do not give hatred. Do not condemn others. Give joy, grace, blessing, affirmation, praise, kindness and steadfast love. In the true Spirit of Christ, *continue giving* gifts of God. Speak and act fearlessly in support of 'God's Justice.' Live this moment with hope in the joy and the power of the Resurrected Christ!

We can give the Gift of love, and the Gift goes on... God continues!

The M & M Group met on Friday, April 21st and had a brief business meeting before heading to the Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum which is a new modern building on the JCCA campus.

The Holocaust (which was a genocide of Jews, disabled people, and other unwanted people) occurred during WWII in a developed Christian country (Germany). The Museum traced world-wide and uniquely German causes for the state sponsored killing of 6 million people (about the population of Missouri).

Genocides are still occurring in some places. The Museum hopes to educate people to respect, even embrace, racial and human differences.



At the meeting before visiting the museum we decided on July 16th as a date to sponsor a Salad Luncheon after worship.

This will be a Fund-Raiser with a charge of \$8.00 per person with half the money going into Ivy's budget and half to Unleashing Potential (formerly Neighborhood Houses).

Our next meeting will be on Tue., May16th at 1 p.m. We will meet at Ivy Chapel and then carpool to Faust Park to tour their historical Village. They have recently added some new buildings.




