

"The Spirit intercedes for us with *sighs* too deep for human words." These are well -known words from Paul's Letter to the Romans.

"Lord, you have been our help, throughout all generations. Before the mountains were born, before you brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting, you are God... For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night. You sweep people away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning. In the morning, it springs up and flourishes; in the evening, it fades and withers... All our days pass away under your wrath; our years come to an end like a sigh... So teach us to count our days that we may gain a heart of wisdom. Turn, O Lord. How long? Have compassion on your servants! Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days. Make us glad as many days as you have afflicted us, and as many years as we have seen evil. Let your work be manifest to your servants, and your glorious power to their children."

(Psalm 90:1-2, 4-7, 9, 12-16)

There is something about a *sigh* — even one, solitary *sigh*. It is an exhale; an expression of relief. The psalmist captures this emotion. When life in this world concludes, all of our earthly days come to an end like a *sigh*. One can envision the very Spirit of God intervening on our behalf as each human being exhales our final breath. Recall Christ Jesus on the cross. "It was now about noon, and darkness

came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, while the sun's light failed... Then Jesus called out with a loud voice, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.' Having said this, he breathed his last." (Luke 23:44-46) As the author of the Fourth Gospel describes, "After this, knowing that all was now completed, and so that the Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, 'I thirst.' A jar full of wine vinegar was there. So they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a branch of hyssop, and lifted it to his mouth. When he had received the vinegar, Jesus said, 'It is finished.' Then he bowed his head and delivered up his spirit; gave up the ghost." (John 19:28-30)

The last gasp for air followed by a final *sigh* was Jesus' concluding breath. As the ancient psalm describes, so it comes to pass in the Gospel. He breathed his last. All our days come to an end like a *sigh*. How precious is the gift of one, single *sigh*. Yes, even someone's final *sigh* can be precious beyond words.

"Presto! Change-o!" announces a magician right before revealing the astonishing outcome of a magic trick.

With a style all God's own, God announces, "Be transformed!" God's announcement may be less flamboyant, perhaps, than the magician's dramatic exclamation. However, God's feat is no less sensational. Indeed, what God can do is far beyond any mere work of magic! God's Word declares, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God - what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2)

At times, you and I are heard to say, "I don't have all day! I can't wait forever." Yet it is important for us to acknowledge that this is an entirely 'human' sentiment. The Divine does have all day. "God's love is patient. God's love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. God's love never ends!" (First Corinthians 13:4, 7-8) So then, let's not over-react. There's no need to become upset. God's Realm is forever.
