

The word "difficulty" does not appear much in Scripture. One resource indicates a mere 6 uses. The word "difficult" comes in only slightly higher at a grand total of 7 uses. All in all, neither of these words appear often in Holy Scripture. This is rather curious, since earthly life is riddled with many "difficulties." God's Word characteristically is realistic and offers bona fide guidance for prevailing over the array of challenges life presents. This time around, though, it appears that we need to take an approach other than a direct, biblical "word search" to discover the way God leads us toward overcoming hardships.

When confronting "difficulty" (as is true of life in general); perspective can make all the difference. Our calling as Christ's followers is to adopt a joyful outlook; an ever-grateful perspective that God provides blessings galore and gifts unlimited! It is this "cornucopia" perspective that Christ Jesus teaches and lives. As Grandma Ramona lovingly coos to her Granddaughter Bernice in the 1998 film Hope Floats, "Oh, honey. My cup runneth over." With our God and Savior; the horn of plenty is always overflowing. Psalm 23:5 rejoices, "My cup overflows!"

One of the imposing **difficulties** that humans struggle with is our failure to be satisfied. What is required for people to be satisfied? We wind up on the verge of exhaustion dreaming up all sorts of answers to this question. Yet God's Prophet Micah clarifies the remedy for human dissatisfaction: "God has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8)

Consider this provocative, anonymous pearl:

More of Thee, Lord. And less of me.

If the cross were more than an ornament in our sanctuaries, how would church life be different?

How would life be different?

What would this world look like if the cross were more - more than an ornament?

More of Thee, Lord. And less of me.

"Choosing an *abundance* mind-set is not easy in our culture. For one thing, there is evil in the world... There is an imbalance of resources. And there is fear, which fosters a scarcity mind-set... Choosing an abundance mind-set is difficult, not only because of mistrust and fear for the future but also because the scarcity worldview permeates our culture... The scarcity syndrome produces fear of others, and fear sells all kinds of things - guns, security devices, residences in 'safe' neighborhoods, and a variety of insurance. Recall this week's news - any week's news. It reinforces fear... The dry creek-bed of the scarcity syndrome leaves us with a feeling that we're missing something, for we thirst for Life... But it is the New Testament words of abundance - 'faith, hope, and love remain, these three' - that fill the dry creekbed and the inner void that thirsts for more... It's a mystery and therefore a matter for the heart... Through an abundance mentality, we tend to perceive God as the giver of grace, who speaks the language of unconditional love... When we

risk reviewing our worldview, opening ourselves to be transformed by the God of abundance, we begin to stop worrying about sharing our bread. We begin to perceive that all is sacred. We begin to understand that the Mystery is beyond our understanding. We begin to soften our hardened hearts... We remember the One who came to us in a manger and showed us the mystery of God. We recognize our partner in the dance... Yes! This trustworthy God of abundance is the One we find on the spiritual labyrinth that leads to living abundantly." (Marilyn Brown Oden, Abundance: Joyful Living in Christ, 2002)

Our Savior Jesus Christ teaches, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it *abundantly*." (John 10:10)

Through **difficulties**, obstacles and failures; the love of Jesus Christ prevails! The faithful response to receiving God's gifts is offering abundant gifts ourselves. May living abundantly become our 'august approach' - our fresh perspective. Risk it for God. Together, let's all join in Christ's joyful dance.

Joyfully accept God's gifts, and then live abundantly!
