We are recipients of the "free gift of God," the grace gift. "... The end is life eternal.

Trustees

In September, the Trustees were busy inside and out!

Outside they were busy cutting and trimming. Bushes were trimmed around the building and front yard signs, and the tree on the playground hill was trimmed to remove the branches from the power lines. Two dead trees in the front were cut down and six other trees had dead limbs removed. Sections of the trunks were used to rebuild washed out parts of the lane that goes from the lower lot to Fellowship Hall.

Clogged gutters were also cleaned.

Inside, the fire alarm system received its annual UL certification. A fan on the Fellowship Hall AC unit was replaced and the kitchen door and hall door locks were also replaced.

The next highway clean-up is scheduled for Sunday, November 5, weather permitting.


