

Easter lasts more than one day. In fact, the season of Easter is celebrated from Easter Sunday to the Day of Pentecost, a week of weeks—fifty days in all! This time has come to be called The Great Fifty Days.

Easter is the oldest festival of the church year. The Great Fifty Days has been celebrated by the church much longer than some other liturgical seasons, like Advent and Lent. The season from Easter Sunday to Pentecost is celebrated as one long festival, although in the fourth century, another festival day was added—Ascension Day. Ascension Day comes towards the end of Easter season, on the fortieth day, and it is generally considered part of the Easter celebration.

Unlike Christmas, Easter does not fall on the same day each year. Easter is always celebrated on a Sunday, but that Sunday can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25.

Easter is a most joyful season. The color of Easter is white and the symbols associated with season are beautiful and bright. Everything about the celebration points to the glorious resurrection of Jesus.

The Easter celebration reaches its culmination on the Day of Pentecost. On this major festival day, we celebrate the coming of promised gift of the Holy Spirit. We rejoice that Jesus has risen and appeared to his disciples and ascended to heaven. Now the coming of the Spirit gives the church and the power and the necessary gifts to spread the god news to all the world. The color od the Day of Pentecost is red, symbolizing the fire of the Holy Spirit. The Day of Pentecost begins the longest season of the church year, extending until the first Sunday in Advent in December. The days following Pentecost are seen as a time for growth in the Spirit.

Christian Action


Summer is coming and Every Child's Hope will be opening their pool at the end of May.
