

shape our youths' spiritual journey.



Indoors, the Pastor's office was given a refresh, with painting, scrubbing of the carpet, and rebuilding the office lights for LEDs. The second banner, the "Grape Vine Tree", is an original artwork created by




local artist, Mariane Kampfe, who is a member of St. John's UCC of Manchester.
