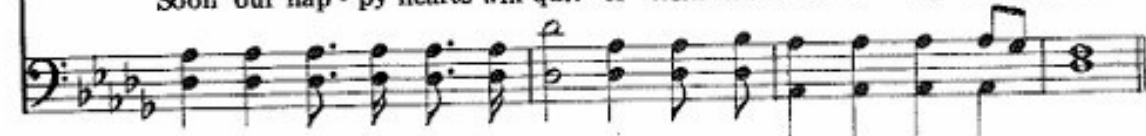

Preparation for Receiving the Sacrament

One: Luke the Evangelist wrote of our Risen Savior Jesus Christ that when he was at table with two of his disciples, he took bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to them, and their eyes were opened, and they recognized him.

All: In company with all believers in every time and beyond time, we come to this table to know Christ in the breaking of the bread.

One: For our Savior Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me."
In the same way, Jesus also took the cup after supper, saying, "This is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."
